Spark A Springtime Meal With Surprise Apple Dish

Summer is a busy time for most families, what with the youngsters out of school and involved with summer camp or summer jobs, and the grownups trying to find time for leisure activities as well as work. It's a good time for Mom to try some new quick desserts that will give the family lots of protein energy.

Here's an all-American treat the whole family will enjoy. It's a good old-fashioned apple pudding, with a modern twist. This Surprise Apple Pudding is a real surprise package because of its topsy-turvy filling. The flavor is delicious, yet the method is simple. Spread the sliced apples (canned or fresh) over the bottom of a buttered baking pan. Pour the easy-to-mix, one egg batter over the apples, then top with a combination of sour cream and brown sugar. The sour cream gives it a wonderful tangy flavor.

Slip it in the oven and forget it for 45-50 minutes. While the pudding bakes, you can be relaxing, finishing other household chores, or fixing a cool salad to make the main course of your meal. While baking, the cake batter rises to the top and forms its own sauce. Surprise Apple Pudding is luscious without any extras, as it has its own rich cream and sugar sauce baked right in. You can, however, serve it warm with a cream or ice cream topping.

Surprise Apple Pudding
9 servings
Buttered square pan, 9x9x2-inch
Preheated 375° Deg. oven
1 1/2 cups dairy sour cream
1 cup firmly packed dark brown sugar
1 can (1 lb. 4 oz.) sliced pie apples
2 tablespoons butter
1/4 cup sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 egg
1 cup sifted flour
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup milk
In a bowl blend together sour cream and brown sugar; set aside. Spread apples evenly in pan. In a small mixing bowl cream together butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add vanilla and egg; beat well. Sift together flour, baking

powder and salt; add to creamed mixture alternately with milk beginning and ending with dry ingredients. Spread evenly over apples. Pour sour cream and brown sugar mixture over batter. Bake 45-50 minutes.
Note: Fresh apples may be substituted for the canned apples. Layer 2 cups of sliced apples in pan; sprinkle with 1/4 cup sugar.

Waley, Principal In Kidnap Case, Receives Parole

TACOMA (UPI) — Harmon M. Waley, 52, one of the principals in the 1935 kidnaping of George P. Weyerhaeuser, has been released on parole from McNeil Island Federal Penitentiary near here, Acting Warden Robert Moseley said this week.

George Weyerhaeuser, then 9, a member of the prominent Tacoma lumber family, was kidnaped May 24, 1935. The boy was released after a \$200,000 ransom was paid.

The kidnapers were captured and imprisoned later that same year. Waley has been at McNeil and other federal prisons for the past 28 years. He was convicted of participating in the kidnaping.

Moseley said Waley was granted parole Monday by the U. S. Board of Paroles. Waley had been sentenced to a prison term of 45 years.

His wife, Margaret, was sentenced to 20 years in prison. She has been released but her present residence is unknown.

Another accomplice, William Mahan, was given 60 years in prison and is still behind bars.

TEMPTING SALAD

Marble Brownies A Hit With Teens

An after-school or weekend get-together to listen to the latest records calls for refreshments. A good choice is Peanut Raisin Marble Squares. Teens will enjoy serving these unusual brownies with milk or a fruit drink. Then pass a basket of "seconds," for one cookie isn't enough.

Peanut Raisin Marble Squares
2 squares (2 oz.) unsweetened chocolate
1 cup sifted flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup soft butter or margarine
1/4 cup granulated sugar
1/4 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
2 teaspoons vanilla flavoring
3 eggs
1 cup coarsely chopped salted peanuts
1 cup seedless raisins
1/2 cup All-Bran (whole bran cereal)

Melt chocolate over hot but not boiling water; remove from heat. Cool. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Blend butter, sugars and vanilla. Add eggs; beat well. Stir in peanuts, raisins and All-Bran. Add sifted dry ingredients; mix well. Spoon half the batter into separate bowl; stir in chocolate. Alternately spoon light and dark batters into well-greased, floured 13 x 9-inch baking pan. Run knife carefully through batter several times to give marbled effect. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) about 30 minutes. Cool. Cut into 2-inch squares.

GELATIN SALAD
Spring menus are much brighter when they include fresh-tasting fruit gelatin salads. Add canned fruit cocktail, cubes of cream cheese and chopped pecans to your favorite flavored gelatin. Chill in pretty individual molds or a large ring mold.

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
