Cubs, Cardinals Deadlocked With SF Giants In NL Race

LINDY McDaniel of the Chicago Cubs and George Altman of the St. Louis Cardinals, who figured in a six-player deal nine months ago, figured again today in a three-way tie for the National League lead.

The fantastic Cubs, Cardinals and slumping San Francisco Giants are all deadlocked for first place and the two men chiefly responsible for the snarl are McDaniel and Altman.

McDaniel, an ordinarily weak-hitting relief pitcher who usually gives way to a pinch hitter, won his own game Thursday with a 10th inning homer off Billy Pierce that beat the Giants 3-2 and gave the Cubs their fifth straight victory.

Third Season Win
The victory was McDaniel's second in as many days, third of the season and the Cubs' 11th in their last 13 contests.

McDaniel was as effective on the mound as he was at bat in handing the Giants their fourth straight setback. Taking over for Barney Schultz with the bases full and one out in the top of the 10th, he picked Willie Mays off second base and then struck out Ed Bailey to end the threat.

Like McDaniel, Altman didn't get into the Cardinals-Phillies game until the late innings but when he did get his chance in the eighth he delivered a pinch double that drove in the winning run in a 5-4 victory for St. Louis.

Started With Cubs
Originally, Altman began his major league career with the Cubs but was dealt to the Cardinals last Oct. 17 in the same trade that sent McDaniel from St. Louis to Chicago.

Frank Robinson and Gordy Coleman paced the Cincinnati Reds to a 7-5 and 10-5 two-night sweep over the Pittsburgh Pirates in the only other NL games scheduled.

Robinson belted his 10th and 11th homers in the opener to help Jim Maloney register his eighth victory in the opener and Coleman drove in five runs in the nightcap as Joey Jay posted his third triumph. Joe Gibbon and Don Schwall were the losing pitchers.

In the American League, the Baltimore Orioles took over first place with a 4-2 win over the New York Yankees while the Washington Senators downed the Boston Red Sox 2-1 for their fourth straight victory in the only other game scheduled.

With hopes high, the Roseburg American Legion juniors are set to begin the second road trip of the season today with five games scheduled in three days.

Tonight the Lockwood Motors crew will open a northern swing at Corvallis in a single nine inning game at 8 on the Corvallis diamond. Then the local nine will move over to Albany for a twin-bill Saturday at 6 p.m. Both games at Albany will be seven innings.

Sunday the team will be home to play at Legion Field for the first time this season, hosting North Bend in a 1:30 p.m. doubleheader. In its opening trip to the south Lockwood Motors came home with

a 1-2 record which it will be out to even up tonight.

Opening on the mound for the Roseburg squad will be Ron Cool, ace lefty from Drain. Cool posted the opening win when he set Ashland down on a nifty one-hitter while fanning 18 batters. The talented southpaw has a variety of good breaking pitches which he mixes with his blazing fast ball. Behind the plate competing the battery in tonight's game will be Sunday's Beamer, Mike Markham is set to spell Beamer as backstop and is tentatively set to catch one game Saturday.

Dick Williams, star of the Roseburg Indians in prep ball, and Jon Burnham, another lefty, are set for starting duties on the hill in Saturday's doublebill. Ron Westbrook, southpaw from Myrtle Creek and Jerry Boucock, Roseburg, will be splitting the pitching duties with Williams and Burnham. Around the infield the starters include Dave Sevall at first, ei-

ther Lance Casebeer or Darrell Callers at second, Bob Manning at short and either Bob Kinyon or Boucock at third.

The outfield will be composed of Mike Blomberg in left, Tom Morrison in center and Bruce Wassom in right.

Manning will be at short for the first time this season, filling in for the injured Artie McDonald. McDonald suffered a sprained ankle in the first game against Central Point last Sunday and is scheduled for only limited duty this weekend. The spunky little short-stop will be sorely missed by the team as he started off the season hitting .500 and showed promise of being a top fielding short-stop. Sevall leads the hit-parade after three games with three hits in five appearances at the plate for a .600 percentage. Blomberg has three hits in nine trips, including a home run and four runs batted in. In reserve coach Bill Harper will have Markham, Rick Abrahamson, Stan Young, Don Evans, Jim Coon, Ray Shepherd and Charles Dornseif.
