

Scholarships Totaling \$6,400 Shared By 12 Glide Graduates

Twelve seniors of Glide High School shared in scholarship awards totaling \$6,400, as announced by Principal John Thompson at the graduation exercises June 3.

Judy Spurgeon received a total of \$800 from three separate awards: \$350 from the Douglas Medical Education Foundation, \$350 from the Roseburg Women of the Moose, both awards specifying nurse's training; and \$100 from the Glide High Girls League.

Arlene Paulson received a total of \$623 from three sources, \$300 from the University of Oregon's Dads Club, \$223 from the State Board of Education and \$100 from the Glide High Girls League.

Victoria Chandler received two awards, \$100 from the Glide Lady Kiwanis Club and \$100 from the Glide High Girls League. The Glide PTA awarded a \$200 scholarship to Norma Haas. The Glide Kiwanis Club gave two \$100 awards, one to Robert Blakely, and one to Grace Carol Smith. The Springfield Beauty College and the Glide

Girls League gave \$100 and \$75 respectively to Donna Thompson. Glenda Anderson was the recipient of a \$200 award from the Roseburg Beauty School. Janet Anderson was awarded \$100 from the Glide Girls League.

The highest award was received by Frank Watkins, a four year scholarship at the University of Washington from the Navy ROTC. This includes all expenses during his 4 years at college; tuition, living expenses, books and supplies and \$50 per month spending money. He automatically will serve a four year term in the Navy upon receiving his Bachelors degree.

Sharon Medlar received two scholarships, one from the Lewis and Clark College at Portland amounting to \$950, and \$200 from the Federated Womens Clubs of Oregon.

The Shell Oil Company is the sponsor for the \$950 grant received by Clarence Bakken from the National Merit Foundation for a 4 year renewable scholarship by qualifying as a finalist in the National Merit Qualifying Tests.
