New Telephone Directories Due Here In July

A background on the "All Number Calling" telephone number identification system, which will be introduced in this area with new directories next month, was presented to Roseburg Kiwanians Tuesday.

Cliff Thomas, local manager for Northwestern Bell Telephone Co., explained the new identification, the reasons for its inception and its difference from direct distance dialing.

Change Not Physical

He explained that all number calling does not involve any physical change from the system of dialing experienced here in the past. It merely means that numbers in the corresponding holes in the telephone dial will be substituted for letters in the same holes. Thus, for example, 673-4441 will be substituted in the directory for OR3-4441 and anyone dialing OR, as previously, will be successful in reaching the desired number.

The reason for the changeover include the fact that many more phones can be identified by number combinations than under the old system; it will assist miniaturization and will make book-keeping easier.

Direct distance dialing is not planned for this area until 1966, he said, because present equipment in the Roseburg exchange is quite modern and there is a problem of adjusting personnel into new jobs within the company.

Reason Cited

Direct distance dialing, Thomas said, is another reason for changing to all number calling. International DDD is "just around the corner" and the numerical system of dialing will help simplify that development.

Thomas was introduced by Eldon Calley.

Biologist Wants More Snake River Spawning Channels

PORTLAND (UPI)—Wendell E. Smith of Boise, a fish biologist for the Idaho Power Co., said this week that he thinks more incubation and spawning channels are necessary in the Snake River.

He told a Federal Power Commission hearing that fish passage over high storage dams, such as Brownlee on the middle Snake after five years of observation, does not appear successful. He warned that other measures of fish protection are needed promptly.

Smith testified under cross examination in the fifth day of the hearing. However, for the small spring Chinook and steelhead runs in the Snake and its tributaries, he recommended improvement of areas where fish spawn naturally in high tributaries.

The hearing was called to determine if Idaho Power Co. has fulfilled its obligation to provide fish conservation facilities at the Oxbow, Brownlee and Little Falls Canyon dams on the Middle Snake. It is presided over by Examiner Allen C. Lande of Washington, D.C.

Smith admitted that more than purely economic factors should be taken into consideration in deciding if use of incubation and other hatchery facilities are more suitable than a spawning channel in protecting spring Chinook and steelhead.
