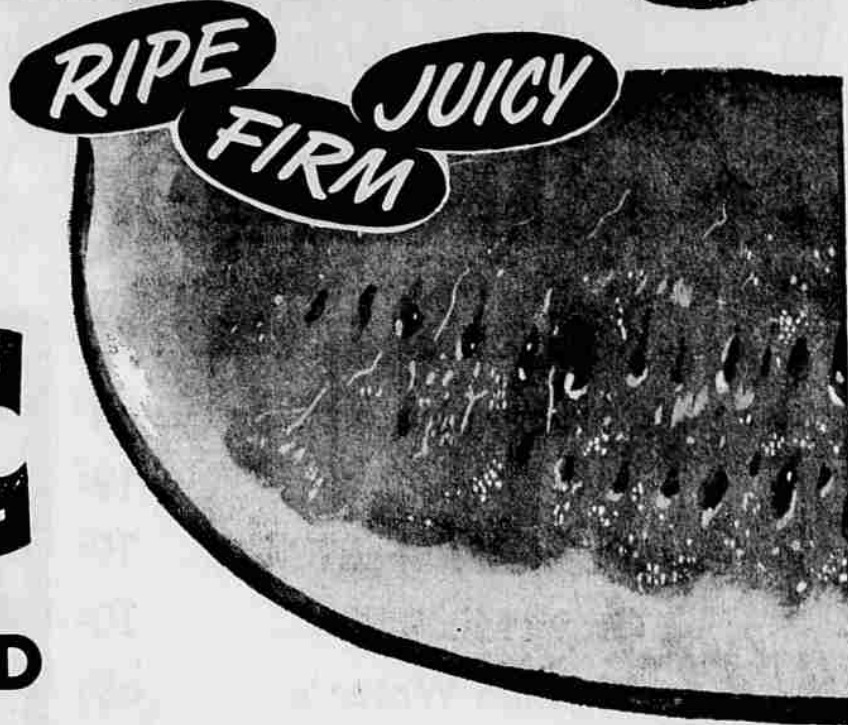

Highway Group Sets Four New Improvements

SALEM (UPI)—The State Highway Commission has authorized location surveys for major improvements on four Oregon Highways.

Two are interstate highway system projects—the Wall Creek-California state line section of the Pacific Highway in Jackson County, which is 7.52 miles in length, and the Oxman-Benson creek section of the Old Oregon Trail highway in Baker and Malheur counties, which is 29.88 miles in length.

The other two surveys approved were for the Arnold Ice Cave Road-horse Ridge section of Highway 20 in Deschutes county and the Independence Junction-Bonville substation section of the Willamina - Salem highway in Polk County.

The commission also authorized acquisition of 104 acres for addition to Detroit Lake State Park. This would triple the size of the existing park.

It authorized negotiations for acquiring 335 acres of additional land for developments at Hat Rock State Park in Umatilla County, Mayer State Park in Wasco County and Sunset Bay State Park in Coos County.

The commission approved seven projects in five counties as part of the \$694,000 construction work authorized on county federal-aid secondary highway system for fiscal 1964. The projects are in Benton, Deschutes, Gilliam, Polk and Washington Counties.

Deschutes County plans to transfer a portion of its allotment to the State Highway Department to spend on the Bachelor Mountain-Big Spring Section of the Cascade Lakes Highway.

Hatfield Asks Federal Funds For State Jobs

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A spokesman for Oregon Gov. Mark Hatfield asked recently that Congress add \$721,000 to President Kennedy's budget for navigation projects in Oregon.

Thomas J. Murray, port consultant to the state, made the request during a brief appearance before the House Public Works Appropriations subcommittee.

He said Hatfield supported budgeted navigation projects totaling \$4,311,000, but also recommended addition of funds for seven projects.

The additions would include \$545,000 for a deeper navigation channel in the Coos and Millicoma rivers, which Murray said would result in big savings to lumber mill operators.

Murray said approval of planning funds for a project to deepen the Willamette River and to resume planning on the Willamette River Falls lock project would expedite construction of the authorized projects. The amounts requested for the two projects were \$46,000 and \$85,000.

Other additions requested by Oregon officials included:—\$2,000 to begin a review study for a barge channel and protective works where Herman Creek enters the Columbia River.

—\$19,000 to begin planning of a barge channel at Columbia Slough.

—\$3,000 to begin a review study of the Charleston small boat basin.

—\$21,000 to plan modification of bar and channel depths on the Siuslaw River and bar.

A delegation from Tillamook County asked that \$1.1 million be appropriated to complete major rehabilitation of the Tillamook north jetty.

NEW YORK (UPI)—Roy Wilkins, executive secretary of the NAACP, issued the following statement today on the slaying in Jackson, Miss., of NAACP state field secretary Medgar Evers.

"The assassination of Medgar Evers demonstrates anew the blind and murderous hatred which obsesses too many Mississippians. In their ignorance they believe that by killing a brave, dedicated and resourceful leader of the civil rights struggle they can kill the movement for human rights. They cannot.

"Every Negro citizen has lost a valiant leader in the death of Medgar Evers. The entire nation has lost a man who believed in America and died defending its principles."
