**SHIRLENE BRAZIE'S FOOD FOR THOUGHT**

Don't limit yourself to one or two salad greens; try head lettuce, leaf lettuce, chicory, endive, watercress, parsley or romaine served separately or in combinations. When buying salad greens, be sure to buy fresh greens. As soon as you get home, wash carefully, drain and put in humidifier. When planning a tossed salad for dinner, wash and prepare greens in the morning, put into a damp tea towel and return to refrigerator. HERE ARE A FEW TRICKS IN SALAD MAKING: Tomatoes should always be peeled before using—put into boiling water and skin can be removed easily. Place carrot shavings into a bowl of ice and they curl. Never wash your wooden salad bowl—wipe with a paper towel that has been dampened, then cover bowl and put it away.
