# Court Convicts Former Solon

BALTIMORE (UPI)—A federal court jury Thursday convicted former congressman Frank W. Boykin of Alabama and Thomas F. Johnson of Maryland and two others on eight counts of conspiracy and conflict of interest.

Johnson and the multi-millionaire Boykin, an Alabama congressman for 28 years, had been charged with using their influence in 1960 and 1961 to urge the Justice Department to drop a mail fraud case against J. Kenneth Edlin, a savings and loan promoter from Miami, Fla.

Edlin and an associate, attorney William F. Robinson of Miami, were found guilty of participating in the conspiracy.

The jury deliberated for three and one-half hours before returning the verdict. Maximum sentences on all the charges would bring each of the four defendants 19 years in jail and fines of \$75,000.

All the defendants said they would appeal the finding. Edward Bennett Williams, attorney for Boykin, was given until July 10 to prepare a motion for a new trial. Judge Roszel C. Thomsen set Aug. 5 to hear all other motions and continued bail for each defendant at \$10,000. All had previously posted the sum.

Johnson, 53, had represented Maryland for two terms. The two legislators — both Democrats — had been defeated in bids for reelection last year, Boykin when the Alabama delegation was reduced from nine to eight by reapportionment.

# May Bond Sales Down In County

Bond sales in Douglas County for the month of May amounted to a total of \$56,208, compared to \$82,923 last year.

Total sales since the beginning of the Freedom Bond Drive May 1 for the Roseburg area amount to \$43,522.50. The goal which local Savings bond leaders hope to reach by the end of the drive on July 4 is \$37,000.

L. J. Fullerton, county bond sales chairman, expressed hopes that by July 4 every family in the county having a regular income would "help his country while helping himself" by buying at least one extra savings bond.

Total sales through May 31 in the county amounted to \$336,510, compared to \$324,317 a year ago.

# U.S. BOAT HELD

GUAYAQUIL, Ecuador (UPI)—The American fishing boat Espritu Santo, seized Wednesday off the coast of Manabí Province, is being held under police guard at the Salinas naval base, it was reported today.

Although the reason for seizing the boat was not announced immediately, there were reports that it was being held on the same "pirate fishing" charge brought against the San Diego tuna boats White Star and Ranger when they were seized late last month.

The tuna boats were released this week after their owners paid fines and other penalties totaling more than \$26,000.

LYON, France (UPI)—Social worker Jacques Farin won a municipal election four months ago for his work in adapting himself "to the environment of juvenile delinquents."

Farin was sentenced to three years in jail Wednesday as the leader of a teen-age gang of burglars.

# Negroes Plan Protest March

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Negro leaders expected 3,000 to 4,000 Negroes to march today from the White House to the Justice Department to protest racial discrimination in the nation's capital.

Julius Hobson, District of Columbia leader of the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), said the demonstration was "not necessarily to criticize the Kennedy administration, but to direct attention to the situation here in the district."

He said the demonstration was being held particularly to point up "the failure of the (district) commissioners to issue a fair housing regulation and to do anything about fair employment."

"Our protest will be orderly and non-violent," Hobson said. "Some Negro leaders have threatened sit-in demonstrations on Capitol Hill if civil rights legislation does not progress to their satisfaction. Congressmen Thursday denounced such a move."

Rep. Emanuel Celler, D-N.Y., a strong supporter of civil rights legislation, said Negroes would harm their own cause with such a demonstration.

He told Negro leaders at a House hearing on civil rights legislation that "there will be deep resentment and it will prejudice your cause."
