STOCKPILING STOPS

WASHINGTON (UPI)—"Excessive" stockpiling of sugar has stopped and a decline in supply has set in, the Agriculture Department said Friday.
The agency said that during the week ended June 8, the primary distributors—refiners, processors, and importers of refined sugar—sold only 134,571 tons. This was the lowest sale in a single week since February, and compared to 176,326 tons in the previous week and 211,869 tons in the corresponding week last year.

The sharp rise in the price of sugar during April and May was attributed primarily to the excessive buying which took place in anticipation of higher prices, the department said. The price of raw sugar has dropped substantially since reaching a peak on May 23. On June 13, it was 8.5 cents a pound, compared with 13.2 cents a pound on May 23.
