Columbia Event Shows Good Play

Just last month I played in Columbia at my first South Bridgeland tournament. I have never played in a nicer one anywhere and I certainly hope to be back again.
What I believe to be the best hand of the tournament was a four-club contract made by John Myers of Columbia.
West opened the deuce of spades. East won with the ace and continued with the queen in order to force dummy to ruff, but John was not going to fall into that trap. He discarded the deuce of diamonds from dummy.

Then East shifted to the three of diamonds, but John was ready. He rose with the ace just as if he were looking right at East's singleton. John led the nine of hearts and let it ride to East's queen. Now it did not matter what East did, but

actually he led a trump. John won with dummy's king, led a heart to dummy's ace, ruffed out East's king of hearts, returned to dummy with the ten of trumps, discarded his three diamonds on the last trick and made the last trick with his last trump.
Incidentally, a diamond shift at trick two instead of the spade continuation would have beaten the contract, but that does not detract one iota from John's play.

Maris Belts Two; Yanks Win Fifth

It's a wonderful theory for those who hope this will be one of those rare years in which the Yankees do not win the American League pennant but it's being drowned out by the thunder of Maris' bat.
The Yankees have reeled off five straight victories and it's no coincidence that Maris was walked away at a 500 clip during those five games. The 9-for-18 splurge has lifted his season average to .289 and he's connected for 11 homers and driven in 21 runs.
Maris made it easy for Whitey Ford to post his ninth win of the season Tuesday night when he hit two homers and a single in the Yankees' 10-5 triumph over the Washington Senators. Tom Tresh and Tony Kubek also homered, and Hector Lopez had a triple as the Yankees moved a full game ahead of the Chicago White Sox, who lost to the Minnesota Twins, 5-3.
The Cleveland Indians defeated the Baltimore Orioles, 7-3, the Boston Red Sox routed the Detroit Tigers, 9-0, and the Los Angeles Angels scored an 11-inning, 2-1 victory over the Kansas City Athletics in other AL games.
Harmon Killebrew's 11th homer of the season helped the Twins drop the White Sox a full game behind the Yankees. Jim Perry pitched eight-hit ball for seven innings and Bill Dailey closed it out with two strong relief innings. Joel Horlen suffered his second defeat against four wins for the White Sox.
Barry Latman pitched a five-hitter and contributed a two-run double to an attack that carried the Indians to their sixth straight victory and their 16th in their last 18 games. Latman struck out 10 en route to his third win. Willie Kirkland homered for the Indians and Jim Gentile connected for the Orioles.
The Red Sox spoiled Charlie Dressen's debut as manager of the Tigers as Earl Wilson pitched a four-hitter and homers by Eddie Bressoud and Dick Stuart paced Boston's late-inning attack. It was the eighth straight loss for the Tigers, playing their first game under Dressen after Bob Scheffing was fired.
A wild pitch with the bases filled by John Wyatt enabled the Angels to score the winning run against the Athletics in the 11th inning. Ken McBride pitched a three-hitter and struck out seven in going the distance to win his seventh game against six losses.
