ACCUSES U.S.

TOKYO (UPI) — The North Vietnamese army high command has accused the United States of "feverishly" accelerating the buildup of American military forces in South Viet Nam, Hanoi Radio reported in a broadcast monitored here today.

The radio said the Communist army high command demanded that the International Control Commission "draw appropriate conclusions and urge the United States to cease all introduction" of military personnel and equipment into South Viet Nam.
