Diverse Suits Filed

Glenn vs. Ned Kelly. Married June 20, 1962, at Dillard. Cruelly charged. Plaintiff asks custody of minor child and \$10 monthly support for herself and child. Plaintiff asks award of 1957 automobile and certain furniture, with other furnishings going to defendant. She also asks attorney fees and court costs. Upon motion and affidavit of plaintiff, defendant restrained from personally or by inducing his relatives, friends or others from interfering with or molesting plaintiff or with her custody of minor child during suit. Plaintiff awarded temporary custody of child. Show cause order issued as to temporary support and attorney fees.

Betty Mae vs. Raymond Ward Mitchell. Married in Reedsport May 13, 1954. Cruelly charged. Plaintiff asks custody of three minor children and \$50 monthly support for each, attorney fees and award of real property as described, 1959 automobile and household furnishings, with 1940 pickup going to defendant.

Yvonne vs. Ray Gaswin. Married at Roseburg Sept. 1, 1962. Cruelly charged. Plaintiff asks custody of minor child and \$50 monthly support. Plaintiff would waive automobile to defendant and asks that he pay off listed obligations. She asks award of household furnishings, attorney fees and suit costs. On motion and affidavit of plaintiff, defendant restrained from in any manner interfering with or molesting plaintiff. Defendant ordered to vacate and remove from premises at 201 Currier St., Roseburg, immediately. Defendant to appear June 24 to show cause as to temporary child support and \$100 monthly support for herself pending suit.

Julia vs. Gail Hagen. Married at Wadeno, Minn., Sept. 2, 1962. Cruelly charged. Defendant would grant child custody to defendant and pay \$50 monthly support for each of two children.

Virginia Mae vs. Robert Edward Tomerlin. Married in Longview, Wash., Oct. 1, 1955. Cruelly charged. Plaintiff asks custody of two minor children and \$50 monthly support for each. She also asks award of furnishings at Lake Oswego and one-half of the remainder of all plaintiff's and defendant's personal property listed in complaint, including stocks and bank accounts. Court order awards plaintiff temporary child custody, restrains defendant from molesting plaintiff in any way or going upon the premises of the residence of the plaintiff or interfering with the plaintiff in the conduct of her business or care of children. Show cause order issued as to taking of adverse party deposition by defendant, and for child support. Defendant restrained from disposing of any personal property in their names or withdrawing funds or sums from bank savings.

Use Avocados For Elegance

If you're planning a Sunday brunch, here's a crowd-pleasing recipe using delicious California avocados. "Rainbow Brunch Special" is just about as colorful as a canneloni, what with its light green-yellow fruit from the avocado, tomato wedges, and crisp bacon perched atop dill-flavored scrambled eggs. Keep several avocados on hand to serve eating-ripe when you wish to add an elegant touch to otherwise run-of-the-mill dishes. Summer varieties of California avocado begin coming into markets the end of May. Insert a toothpick in the stem end of the fruit. If it goes in easily, the avocado is eating-ripe.

Rainbow Brunch Special

1 California avocado
4 slices bacon
1/4 cup soft bread crumbs
6 eggs
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/4 teaspoon dill weed
1/4 cup milk
1 medium-size tomato
Cut avocado lengthwise into halves; remove seed and skin. Cut fruit into cubes. Cut bacon into 1-inch lengths; fry until crisp. Remove bacon; drain off all but 1-tablespoon fat. Toast crumbs in bacon fat until crisp; remove crumbs; heat eggs lightly and add salt, pepper, dill weed and milk. Turn into pan in which bacon was cooked and cook over low heat, stirring from bottom of pan as eggs set. When almost set, add avocado, bacon and crumbs and finish cooking. Cut tomato into wedges and arrange over eggs. Serve at once.
