Yoncalla Board Hires Teachers

The resignations of two teachers, Gene Hitchman and Scott Phillips, were accepted at the last meeting of the Yoncalla School Board. Jewel Pyle of Sutherland was hired to teach mathematics and science in the high school and Kathryn Mae Nelson of Reedsport, was hired to teach girls' sports in the grade school, correspondent Mrs. George Edes reports.

In other action, the board voted to allow the Lions Club use of the school bus again this year for transportation of children of the area to the Drain swimming pool on Wednesdays and Thursdays during the summer and to let the Pee Wee baseball team have use of the bus during its tournament play. A regular school bus driver will drive the bus, so that the insurance requirements will be met. Approval was also given for use of the grade school lunch room for another year's meetings of the North Douglas Farm Bureau.
