The Roseburg Rural Fire Department was kept busy Sunday with a false alarm, washing gasoline off the highway and a small grass fire on Mt. Nebo.

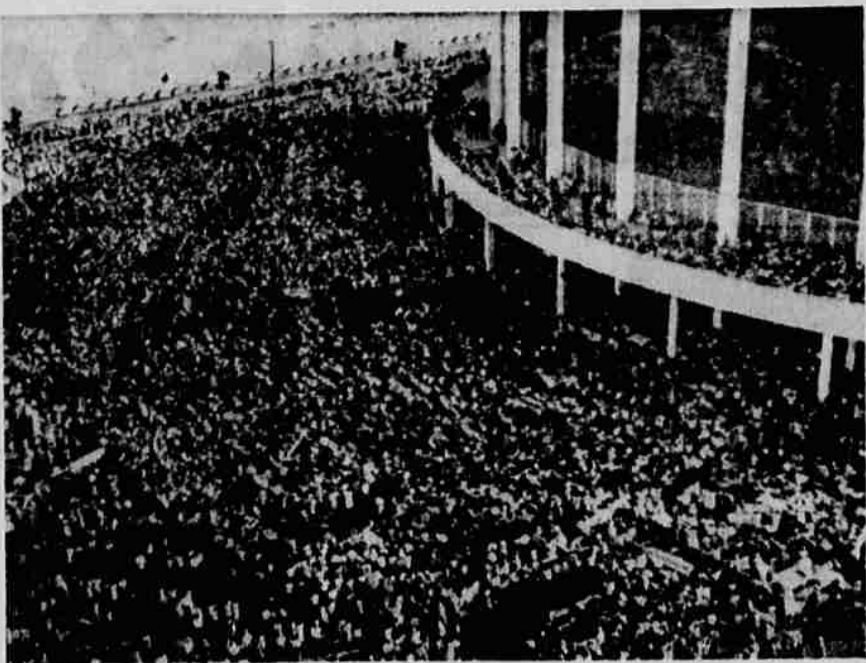
