Senate Expected To Pass Bill To Extend Excise Tax

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Senate was expected to approve today and send to the White House a bill to extend for another year federal corporation and consumer excise taxes.

Approval of the House-passed measure is necessary to prevent expiration of the taxes and loss

of \$4.2 billion in annual revenues at midnight Sunday.

Under the bill, taxes on corporations, and excise taxes on such items as liquor, beer, new cars and auto parts, and cigarettes would be extended until June 30, 1964.

There were first imposed in 1951 as "emergency" Korean War taxes and have been extended by Congress each year since.

The bill also extends the 10 per cent tax on general telephone service and the 5 per cent tax on airline tickets, both imposed in 1959.

Unless extended, the present corporate tax of 52 per cent would drop to 47 per cent. This is by far the largest revenue-producer in the bill, bringing in an estimated \$2.5 billion a year.

Present federal taxes on a pack of cigarettes would fall from eight to seven cents, wine taxes an average of 11 per cent, and taxes on whisky and other distilled "hard" spirits from \$10.50 to \$9 per gallon.

Other congressional news: Cuba: House Republicans planned today to introduce a resolution calling for a stronger administration stand on Soviet troops and communism in Cuba. The resolution would declare the presence of Soviet troops and equipment in Cuba a "clear violation of the Monroe Doctrine."

Depressed Areas: Senate Democrats organized support for the administration's \$455 million request to expand federal aid to depressed areas. The bill, defeated by the House in President Kennedy's worst defeat of the session, comes up for Senate debate Tuesday. Backers hope to pass it and send it back to the House for a second try.

Britain Brings Eight New Charges Against Society Osteopath

LONDON (UPI)—The government today brought eight new charges against Dr. Stephen Ward, the society osteopath and artist who opened the door for the Profumo scandal.

Prosecutors did not immediately make public details of the new charges, but they told a Marlborough magistrate's court the charges did not involve security violations.

Ward is the man who introduced former War Minister John Profumo to call girl Christine Keeler. Their illicit love affair led to Profumo's resignation and a government crisis.

Ward has been in jail on charges on living off earnings of prostitutes.

The Profumo scandal touched the royal family openly today with a press report denying that Prince Philip was involved in the affair.

The unprecedented front-page statement in the Daily Mirror, which was expected to cause a sensation, was one of several new sex and security reports building further pressure against the government of Prime Minister Harold Macmillan.
