Roseburg's American Legion Juniors face a busy week of baseball action with seven games on tap as the season nears the midpoint.

Tonight the Lockwood Motors nine will host Grants Pass in a non-league twin-bill at 6:30 p.m. at Legion Field. Thursday a pair of Doug-Lane League counters are on tap at South Eugene against Pitchford's. Game time at South Eugene is set for 4 p.m.

Friday the local crew will head for the coast and a single non-counter with Marshfield. The nine-inning outing at Marshfield is scheduled for 8 p.m.

Sunday it will be back to league play, with powerful Springfield invading Legion Field for a 6:30 p.m. double bill.

Going into the league outings with Pitchford's, Roseburg is atop the standings with perfect 4-0 record. Following close on the heels of the local crew is Springfield with a 4-1 mark, Snellstrom Lumber (Sheldon) with a 2-1 record and South Eugene.

Pitchford's has handed Springfield its lone setback, 2-0, as Jerry Giesvold twirled a fifty-one-hitter. Giesvold is an almost certain starter in one of the outings against Lockwood Motors.

In league action Ron Cool and Dick Williams are scheduled to handle the majority of the pitching chores. Cool leads the Roseburg mound staff with a 6-0 record. The flashy Drain left-hander has fanned 86 batters in 33 innings.

Williams has compiled a 4-1 record on the season. Set for action in the non-league outings is Ron Westbrook, 2-2, Jerry Boucock (1-1), John Burnham (0-1) and Rogelio Gutierrez (0-0). Gutierrez recently joined the Roseburg team and is expected to make his debut this week.

Jim Beamer will work behind the plate for Lockwood Motors, with Mike Markham capable of giving the veteran backstop some rest. Beamer leads the team in RBIs with 17 and is packing a healthy .358 batting average.

Tentative infield starters include Dave Sevall at first, Lance Casebeer at second, Boucock or Bob Kinyon at third and Artie McDonald at short. Boucock is the top hitter among the regulars with a .409 average. The spunky third baseman-pitcher has only been at bat 22 official times, but many walks have helped him to score 10 runs.

In the outfield Roseburg will have Mike Blomberg in left, Bob Manning in center and Tom Morrison in right.

Going into tonight's game with Grants Pass, the local crew will be trying to get back on the win track after having a nine-game

streak stopped by Central Point Sunday when the Cheney Studs posted a 1-0 triumph in the second game of a twin-bill. Grants Pass has a 3-1 league record in Southern Oregon play.

Other Doug-Lane League outings on tap this week finds Springfield meeting Snellstrom Lumber (Sheldon) in a single game Wednesday at 6 p.m. on the North Eugene diamond and Martin Bros. Signs (North Eugene) will be at Willamette High to meet Bethel Legion (Willamette) at 6:30. Friday Bethel Legion and Martin Bros. will play the second game of the series at North Eugene at 6 p.m.

Giants Back On Top; Dodgers Stop Reds

 The good professors must pass out rubber arms along with the diplomas at Michigan State University.

Exhibit A is Dick Radatz of the Boston Red Sox—the American League's relief pitching marvel. And Exhibit B is Ron Perranoski of the Los Angeles Dodgers—perhaps the No. 1 relief ace in the National League.

Both attended Michigan State in the late 1950s and then went on to careers in big league baseball. Radatz is a huge right-hander and Perranoski a slim left-hander but both get the job done in remarkable fashion.

Perranoski, sometimes overlooked because of the presence of Don Drysdale and Sandy Koufax on the Los Angeles staff, has compiled a 7-2 record. He's relieved in the Dodgers' last five games, pitching a total of nine innings without allowing a run.

The 28-year-old native of Paterson, N.J., hustled out of the bullpen for the fifth straight game Monday night and pitched two scoreless innings to preserve a 5-4 victory over the Cincinnati Reds that lifted the Dodgers to within one game of the National League lead. His airtight hurling also enabled the Dodgers to end

the Reds' seven-game winning streak.

Drysdale, battling to stay over .300 this year after his 25-9 record in 1962, pitched a no-hitter for five innings and a two-out shutout for seven before he suddenly lost his stuff. Perranoski yielded two hits but pitched his way out of the jam and then closed out the game in the ninth.

Willie Davis homered after walks by Maury Wills and Jim Gilliam in the third inning and the Dodgers added a fourth run in the frame on singles by Tommy Davis, Wally Moon and Ron Fairly. Joey Jay was the victim of the rally and suffered his 11th loss against three victories.

The San Francisco Giants regained the NL lead with a 4-3 victory over the St. Louis Cardinals and the Milwaukee Braves defeated the Houston Colts, 3-0, in other National League games.

In the American League, the Chicago White Sox topped the New York Yankees, 5-2, the Minnesota Twins beat the Baltimore Orioles, 6-4, the Boston Red Sox downed the Cleveland Indians, 7-5, the Kansas City Athletics tripped the Detroit Tigers, 6-3, and the Los Angeles Angels edged the Washington Senators, 3-2.

Juan Marichal went 6 2/3 innings before Billy Pierce took over to win his 12th game for the Giants, who scored all their runs off of Law Burdette in the first inning. Chuck Hiller and Jim Davenport had two hits each for the Giants and Julian Javier homered for the Cardinals.

MC Babe Ruthers Twirl No-Hitter

Gerald Davenport and Bill See combined pitching talents to toss a no-hitter for the Myrtle Creek Babe Ruth team in a non-league outing against Winston.

While Davenport and See were handcuffing the Winstonites, their teammates backed them with 29 runs as the South Douglas power ran off with a lopsided 29-1 triumph.

The no-hitter by the pair of Myrtle Creekers was the first recorded in South Douglas Babe Ruth play, in spite of coming in a non-league game.

Davenport worked the first three innings and See came on to finish the last four. The two Myrtle Creek chuekers struck out 16 Winston batters.

Myrtle Creek unleashed a 31-hit attack to score its 29 runs. Slove Gordon led the hit parade with five base bats in six at bats, while John Benson had a perfect 3-3 game, including a three-run homer which landed 387 feet from home plate. Davenport helped his own cause with a 3-3 day at the plate.

In rolling to the lopsided win, Myrtle Creek batted around three times in one inning.

Giardello Records Unanimous Decision

PHILADELPHIA (UPI)—Sugar Ray Robinson planned to announce today whether he would retire because of last night's lopsided beating by middleweight contender Joey Giardello at Convention Hall here.

Giardello of Philadelphia, third ranking contender, fanned 43-year-old Ray in the fourth round and holding on in other sessions as Joey won a unanimous 10-round decision.

A near-capacity crowd of 8,598, which paid an estimated \$50,000, roared encouragement to Robinson—the former welterweight champion and record five-time middleweight ruler—in the seventh and eighth rounds when Ray rallied magnificently. But he ran out of gas again in the ninth and 10th.</
