

Swim Team Set To Meet First 2 Foes

Roseburg's aquatic aces are busy with intensive practice sessions in preparation for the opening meet June 29 when the local team travels south to take on Grants Pass and Medford at Medford.

Tom Keel, director of parks, reports that at the present time 55 swimmers are on the team, with 45 active members participating in the daily practice sessions. However, more are needed in all age brackets, with the younger swimmers urged to turn out before the July 3 deadline.

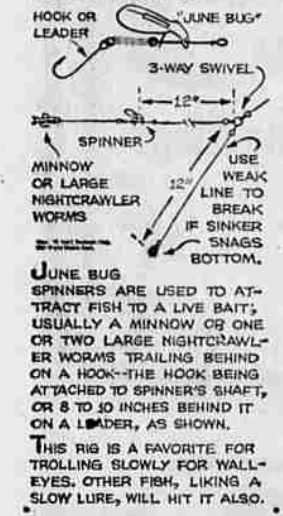
The beginning age for swimmers is 8. In meet competition the youngsters are bracketed according to age and will not be in action against older swimmers. Any youngster wishing to turn out for the team is urged to report for practice any morning this week or until Wednesday of next week.

Coaching the Roseburg team this year will be Brent Arnold and Tom Jochums, both with strong backgrounds in competitive swimming.

Practice sessions are held daily Monday through Saturday at the Municipal Pool from 8 to 10:30 a.m. and from 5 to 6 p.m.

Fireman Pregenzer Puts Out Hawaii Fire To Save Another Victory For Tacoma 9

Those cheers you hear across the land today are from the far-flung John Pregenzer Fan Club rejoicing that their hero has saved another ball game for Tacoma.

The fan club, which numbers Pierre Salinger and novelist Norman Mailer among its legions, was formed when the big teacher was pitching for the San Francisco Giants.

John's departure for Tacoma caused a momentous good-bye celebration and festivities have been repeated frequently because John is about the PCL's toughest firemen and keeps saving wins for Tacomans.

He came on in the seventh Tuesday night at Honolulu with two out, the bases jammed and Tacoma nursing a 5-4 lead. He retired the next batter and breezed through the final two in-

nings, fanning five men.

In other results, Spokane punched out a 4-2 win over Oklahoma city to keep a game and a half back of Tacoma in the northern division. Dallas-Ft. Worth edged Portland 5-4 to widen its lead in the southern division since Oklahoma City and San Diego lost. The Padres were dumped by Denver, 9-2.

Top Track Stars Appear In Corvallis On Weekend

Many of America's finest all-around track and field athletes will invade Corvallis Friday and Saturday for the 45th annual national decathlon championship on Bell Field.

The event is under the auspices of the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States and sponsored by the Corvallis 30-Staters Club.

World record holder C. K. Yang of Formosa, 1962 meet champion, will be unable to compete here because of injuries that prevented proper conditioning, but a star-studded field is already assured. At last count Monday, Director Sam Bell had received 20 entries, including such standout performers as Phil Mulkey, Paul Herman, Dave Edstrom and Oregon State's Steve Pauly.

Herman and Pauly were the No. 1 and No. 2 ranking Americans last year in decathlon, and competed against Russia at Palo Alto last summer. Herman is the former Westmont College star now under the banner of the U. S. Army. Edstrom represents Oxnard Air Force Base and last spring dethroned perennial champion Mulkey at the Kansas Relays decathlon. He is an ex-Oregon star.

Other entrants are John Albitz, Penn Hills (Pa.) Striders; Joe Anderson, Cupertino (Cal) high school; John Dobroth, Joe Hilbe and Bill Toomey, Santa Clara Youth Village; Denny Ellis, Southern Oregon College; Dick Emberger, Camp Pendleton Marines; Bob Giombetti, Milwaukee (Wisc.) Track Club; Russ Hodge, Oxnard Air Force Base; Nat Johnson, Anderson (Ind.) Community AC; Larry Jones, Oregon State University.

Charles Mosely, University of Alabama; Eugene McCleary, Harrisburg (Pa.) Athletic Club; Bill Smith, Dayton (Ohio) Athletic Club; Henry Wadsworth, United States Army; and Tod Williams, Princeton U.

The meet will be conducted in two separate flights, starting Friday at 9:30 a.m. Friday slate includes the 100-meters, broad jump,

shotput, high jump and 400 meters, while on Saturday events are 110-meter high hurdles; discus, pole vault, javelin and 1500 meters.

Yang holds the world record of 9,121 points set this spring. Herman's all-time best was 8,961, while Pauly has scored 7,228. Pauly has nursed an injured foot the past two months, but reports he is in good condition for the meet.
