victories Wednesday. Behind the no-hit pitching of Pat Long, Roseburg broke a 3-3 deadlock with a three-run rally in the fourth inning and went on to post a 7-3 win over Eastwood. The victory was Roseburg's second in three league outings.

Long was near perfection as he shut-out the Fremont nine on a classy no-hitter. The flashy Riverside 15-year old hurler struck out eight and did not walk a batter. Long's bid for a perfect game was ruined by two errors.

In addition to tossing the win, Long led the winners at the plate with a double and a triple in three appearances.

The winners opened the scoring with a single run in the second inning when Larry Forrest doubled, moved to third on a ground out and scored on a passed ball.

A four-run uprising moved Riverside well out in front in the third frame. Two walks and a single by Tom Hoskot loaded the bases. Chris Hansen drove in two runs with a base rap, and Long followed with a two-run single. A walk, an error and Long's triple gave Riverside its final two tallies in the fourth.

Roseburg got off to a fast start to grab a 3-1 lead in the first inning of its game with Eastwood. The first inning rally was started by Rob Taylor who drew a walk. Byrd and Don Woodman followed with base raps to account for the three runs.

Eastwood fought from behind to score single runs in the second and third innings to knot the score at 3-3.

At this point Roseburg exploded for three more runs. A pair of walks started the sixth inning uprising for the winners, while Doug Connine's double and Byrd's triple provided the necessary power at the plate.

Byrd led the winners for a single, a double and a triple for three at bats, while Mike Stec belted a triple in the fifth inning.

The next games on tap in the Roseburg Division will be played Monday at Finlay Field with Roseburg meeting Fremont and Riverside playing Eastwood. Game times are 5:30 and 7:20 p.m.

Withrow Belts Homers To Provide Denver With Victory In PCL Battle

 There's a nip and tuck battle for the homerun leadership in the Pacific Coast League these days. In fact, it's an outright dead-

lock with Corky Withrow and Deron Johnson of San Diego each having 18.

Withrow moved into the tie Wednesday night by banging out a pair of round trippers to give Denver a 10-9 victory in 10 innings over San Diego. He drove in three runs in a four-run rally in the ninth to tie the score.

In other games Salt Lake City took its fourth straight victory and second straight doubleheader from Seattle, while Dallas-Fort Worth outlasted Portland, and Spokane scored three runs in each of the second, third and fourth innings to down Oklahoma City.

The Hawaiian Islanders apparently appreciated the crowd of 4,324 on hand as they evened their season with Northern Division Leader Tacoma. The Islanders took a one hour and 52 minute 3-0 contest with Fred Newman allowing only one runner to reach second base.

Hawaiian first sacker Mickey Harrington came within one putout of tying the record for putouts by first basemen. He had 20.

A last inning flurry gave the Bears their victory over San Di-

The winning run scored when Bob Uecker went to third on two walks after singling to open the frame. He scored on a sacrifice fly by J. W. Porter.

Roger Clapp chalked up his third victory against as many losses in relief. Dave Sisler was the loser, also in relief. Denver's Lou Klimchick hit safely in his 16th straight game.

The Dallas-Fort Worth Rangers used the come-from-behind maneuver to take a 4-3 victory over Portland and moved 2 1/2 games ahead of Oklahoma City in the Southern Division.

The Beavers held a 3-0 bulge scoring all runs off starter Marv Mecklenberg. However, four relief hurlers held them in check as Don Williams took the decision.

The winning run was scored in the seventh on a single, a hit batsman, an error and singles by George Banks and Ray Jablonski.

A sterling one-hit pitching performance was turned in by Gordy Seyfried in the seven-inning night-

cap of a twin bill between Salt Lake City and Seattle. The Bees won both ends, 2-4 and 2-0.

Rac Slider got the lone hit off the big right hander as he faced only the minimum of batters through five and one-third innings. Slider got a sharp single in the sixth. Bill Spanswick was the loser but he did a creditable job on the mound, giving up six hits and striking out 11. He lost his fourth game against six wins while Seyfried now has a 6-8 mark.

Seven big runs in the first inning of the opener were enough to allow lefty Wayne Carlander to gain an easy triumph and bring his season mark to 4-5. Jerry Stephenson, victim of the first inning uprising, was charged with the loss. He now has 2-8.

Dave Gusti took the brunt of a cannonading by Spokane batters as six runs crossed the plate in the first three innings. Big offensive weapon for Spokane was an Oklahoma City native, catcher Mike Brumley, who came back to haunt the 89ers. He went three for five, driving in three mates. John Werhas smashed two home runs and Dick Berardino got one for winners.
