

Negroes Schedule Savannah Rally To Decide On New Demonstrations

Negroes have scheduled a mass rally in Savannah, Ga., tonight to decide whether to resume demonstrations in that racial trouble-spot.

Further demonstrations were called off Monday pending the outcome of negotiations between white and Negro leaders. But demonstration leader Hosea Williams threatened Thursday to resume mass protests unless six Negro demonstrators were released from jail.

The trials of more than 200 Negroes charged with violating a no-demonstration injunction began today at Gadsden, Ala. More than 50 Negroes were arrested Thursday for staging a "peaceful protest march" through downtown Gadsden.

Court Suit Seeks Injunction Against Property Owners

Douglas County, through its county court, has filed a suit in Circuit Court asking a mandatory injunction against Hiram B. and Melba L. Germond, to permit surveyors and others to go onto their property for the purpose of bridge and road construction.

The property is located along the Hubbard Creek section of the Edgewater-Millwood County Road No. 6, which the county is improving. When surveyors for contractors went on the property to make studies for submitting bids, they were ordered off by Germond, the complaint alleges.

Jury Favors Defendant In Suit For Damages

Verdict favoring the defendants, Swift Trucking Co. and Bradford S. Gritman, was entered by a jury at the conclusion of a two-day trial this week in the court of Charles S. Woodrich.

The plaintiff, James E. Howell, has asked \$10,000 general damages for injuries allegedly suffered May 8, 1962, when the automobile in which he was a guest passenger was involved in an accident with a truck of Swift Trucking, operated by Gritman.

Roseburg Police Catch Young Purse Snatchers

Three boys, two of them age 11 and the other 9, were taken into custody by city police then turned over to juvenile authorities for purse snatching.

Betty Louise Robertson reported to police that a purse was snatched from her daughter, Karen, 11, Thursday by three boys. She later found the purse, but the billfold in it, containing \$8.40, was missing.

Highway Office Has Oakland Street Maps

New street maps of Oakland are now available to the public through the Oregon State Highway Department.

The maps include markings for post office, schools, railroad station, city hall, and library. Streets are marked as open for travel or dedicated, but not open. The maps were prepared in co-operation with the Bureau of Public Roads.

Road Closure Set

The Bureau of Public Roads reports that the Camp Creek Road in western Douglas County will be closed for five days, starting July 1.

Persons wanting these maps may purchase them by writing the Traffic Engineering Division, State Highway Building, Salem 10, Oregon. Cost of the Oakland maps are 25 cents for the large size and 10 cents for the small.

CD Director Says U.S. Funds For Counties May Be Withheld

SALEM (UPI) — Federal funds approved Thursday for five county civil defense organizations may be withdrawn because matching funds to bolster the state agency were denied, State CD Director Robert Sandstrom indicated.

He said he would call the five counties "to determine what it means to them if we do not administer the program for them."

Benton County authorities, and was told loss of federal matching funds would amount to about \$2,000.

The legislature slashed the agency to a three member coordinating staff attached to the governor's office.

Matching funds were approved for Benton, Linn, Umatilla, Polk and Washington counties, with the condition that the state provide supervision.

Sandstrom said some counties would not make a decision on whether to drop civil defense until today, the last business day of the current fiscal year.

Bridge Traffic Still Restricted

The Highway 38 bridge across the Umpqua River at Scottsburg is still restricted to one-way traffic and no heavy equipment is allowed on the bridge, state police report.

In addition, Polk and Washington counties were told "if their performance... is not improved" before the next year, they would be denied further federal aid.

Sandstrom said he talked to the week before the bridge can be restored to normal use, but repairs will continue after that. The structure was damaged Tuesday, when a truck of American Pipe & Steel, hauling heavy equipment to the International Paper Co.'s new plant at Gardiner, struck a portion of the bridge.

Navy Secretary To Testify On Fighter Plane Contract

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Senate investigators today called Navy Secretary Fred Korth to testify on reasons behind award of the TFX fighter plane contract to General Dynamics instead of the Boeing Co.

The subcommittee is probing why civilian Pentagon authorities gave General Dynamics the contract, despite recommendations in favor of Boeing by Pentagon military officers. The contract, expected to be worth \$6.5 billion, is for 1,700 fighter planes that would be used by both the Navy and Air Force.
