Too Much Time Taken With Finance Matters At Session

What's wrong with our legislative procedure? Most Oregonians will say there's a lot wrong, especially when it takes 141 days for a session that conducted a modicum of business—and that with an overtone of wrangling, political manipulation, personalities, and disagreement.

Some propose an annual session of the legislature. Others contend that the legislature can cause enough headaches meeting every two years and that annual sessions wouldn't help the situation a bit.

Another suggestion, one that I think is worth considering, is improved staffing. But it seems to me there are a good many ways in which legislative efficiency could be vastly improved.

Would it then be possible, when the legislature came back in session, to act with dispatch on committee reports and thus eliminate a great deal of time-consuming paperwork?
