

New Wayside Park Opens Near Kellogg

Another park in the Douglas County Parks Department system is ready for visitors.

It is the Edgar S. and Emma Madison Wayside near Kellogg.

The 1.6 acre forested wayside on the Umpqua River is a tract donated to the county in 1960 by the Madisons. It is part of their ranch property. It was put into usable shape last week.

The park site was formerly a private ferry landing where the Madison's operated their own ferry up to 1928. They said they conveyed the land for a park so others might enjoy its beautiful setting along the river forever.

The Madisons could be considered pioneers by the younger generation, having lived continuously on their ranch since 1897. They have continued to live in their neat,

er they acquired the land from the original donation land grantee. They and their sons and grandsons still own and maintain more than 500 acres.

The wayside is located on Bullock Road, 5 1/2 miles from its junction with State Highway 225 at the Bullock Bridge. It is 16.8 miles from the junction of the Interstate 5 freeway and Highway 225 at Sutherlin. Improvements consist of a graded parking area, a well and hand pump, four tables, two stoves and rest rooms, reports Parks Department Supervisor Wilbur Wieprecht.

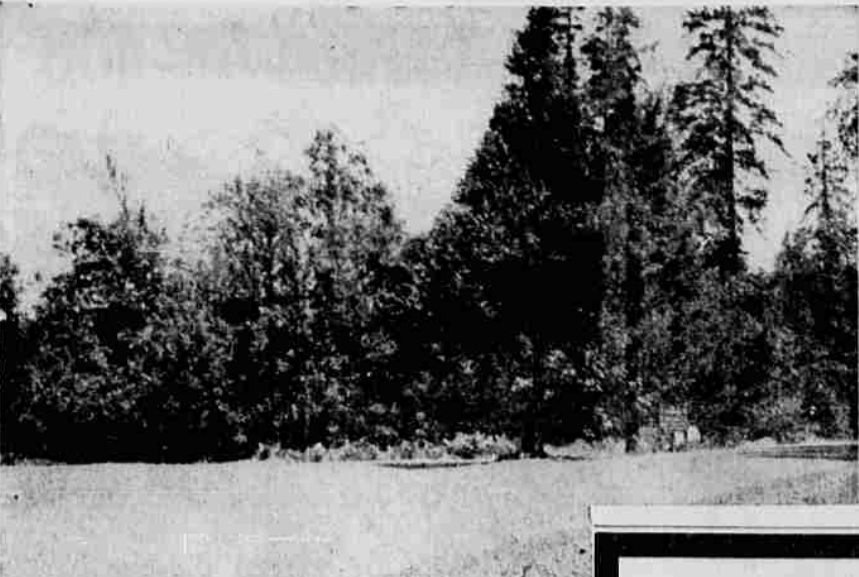

County Logging Firms Win Six Umpqua Timber Tracts

The Bureau of Land Management in Roseburg Friday sold 9,225,000 board feet of timber for \$181,296.20. Of this volume, 37 per cent was sold in order to salvage timber damaged by the Columbus Day windstorm.

Two other tracts received no bid and will be held open for a period of 90 days during which time bids for not less than the appraised price will be received.

The first tract, containing 738,000 board feet, was located north of Glide and was purchased by A. J. Standley for \$15,295.15. High bid for the Douglas fir was \$22.50 per thousand board feet. Other bidder was Lumber Sales, Inc. of Roseburg.

Wilbur White of Days Creek purchased the second tract, located between the North Umpqua and Little River, for \$5,424.90. It contained 348,000 feet of timber. White paid

\$17 per thousand for the Douglas fir. Other bidder was Lumber Sales, Inc.

Woolley Logging Co. of Drain purchased the third tract, containing 4,262,000 feet, located near the head of Brush Creek, for the appraised price of \$61,117.35.

Mt. Baldy Logging Co. of Yoncalla purchased the fourth tract, located on Blow Creek and containing 2,563,000 feet of timber, for the appraised price of \$54,903.25.

The fifth tract, containing 206,000 feet located at the head of Smith River, was purchased by Pappy's Lumber Co. of Yoncalla for \$5,126.60. High bid for the Douglas fir was \$25.50. M. J. Perini also qualified to bid on this tract.

C & D Lumber Co. of Roseburg purchased the sixth tract, containing 1,088,000 feet of timber located in the Silver Butte area, for the appraised price of \$19,428.95.
