

# Khrush Asks Conclusion Of German Peace Treaty

BERLIN (UPI) — Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev said today the "Damocles sword of war" still hangs over the world and once again called for conclusion of a German peace treaty.

But he again refrained from setting a deadline for the signing of such a treaty.

In his speech to an East German rally, Khrushchev once again reaffirmed his policy of "peaceful coexistence" with the West.

## House Bills Ask Extension Of Mexican Labor Program

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Congressional supporters of the controversial bracero program have urged that it be closed over three years.

The proposal was advanced Monday by House members who also have introduced legislation calling for a one-year extension of the program of using Mexican laborers to harvest crops in the United States.

It has been under attack for years by labor unions as depriving U.S. workers of employment, and in a recent surprise move the House refused to extend the existing law for two more years.

Among those advocating the three-year phase out were Reps. F. C. Gathings, D-Ark., and Charles M. Teague, R-Calif. Similar legislation has been introduced in the Senate by Sen. J. William Fulbright, D-Ark.

Teague, who also introduced a bill calling for a one-year extension of the bracero program, said the three-year plan would require a less "drastic and sudden adjustment."

The new proposal would end the program Dec. 31, 1966. From 1964 through 1966 the number of incoming Mexican farm workers would be limited to half the average number permitted in three previous fiscal years.

Gathings, chairman of the agriculture subcommittee which approved the two-year extension rejected by the House, said discontinuance of the program would result in a shortage of workers and an increase in food prices.

Teague, a member of the agriculture committee, said the success of efforts to extend the program would depend "purely on whether enough Democrats can be persuaded to change their votes."

Teague was asked if he thought the committee had erred in approving a two-year extension in the face of administration support of only a one-year extension. He said he did not think it made any difference.

Teague said he had been urging approval of bracero labor to write California Democrats to ask them to vote for an extension. He said Rep. Jeffery Coehlan, D-Calif., one of the opponents of a two-year extension, was "very much unimpressed on this problem."

Another opposition leader, Rep. Henry B. Gonzalez, D-Tex., continued his attack.

"I should hope that we will continue to reject any extension of this act which by injecting a large supply of cheap labor into the American agricultural market prevents the wages of domestic migrant workers from rising through the market forces of supply and demand," he said.
