

Diamond Lake Was Popular Spot For Holiday Visitors

Diamond Lake proved to be one of the most popular recreation spots in the state for the July 4th holiday as a total of 6,600 visitors were reported by Dick Platt, assistant ranger of the Diamond Lake District.

Platt added that 450 boats were on the lake Thursday and 2,000 cars were counted.

Overcast skies and cool weather prevailed, according to Glide correspondent Mrs. Arthur Selby. The temperature reached 59 degrees, with the water surface temperature reported at 60 degrees and the bottom temperature being 57 degrees.

Fishing was excellent with an average of 25 fish per angler being caught.

The campgrounds at Diamond Lake were filled to capacity by 7 p.m. Wednesday, and reports indicate they are still full this morning.

Lemolo Lake fishing was reported excellent, with 465 persons and 100 boats present over the holiday.

Platt stated that during the entire 1962 season only 51,000 fish were caught at Diamond Lake, while during the first six weeks of this season a total of 108,000 fish have been taken by anglers.

Attempt Made To Retake Bunker Hill Thursday

BOSTON (UPI) — A disgruntled Loyalist attempted to retake Bunker Hill Thursday — the Fourth of July.

Police found a small British flag draped at the base of the Bunker Hill monument in Charlestown together with a hand-lettered placard which read:

"Know ye by these presents that the territory is re-claimed in ye name of his Imperial Majesty, George III, King of England & of ye American colonies."

"Further — a bounty of 1,000 pounds is hereby placed on the heads of ye notorious subversives Washington, Jefferson, & Adams."

The proclamation was signed by "Capt. Geoffrey, Newleigh, Yorkshire Irregulars."

S. Oregon Meeting Due At Camp Tye For Horizon Girls

Herb Crouse, engaged for the regular summer camping sessions at Camp Tye, will be camp cook.

On the agenda besides workshops will be a council fire, a "skit night" for the opening session Sunday and a cookout.

Evaluation sessions for the conference will be held at its close late Tuesday afternoon.

Girls attending will have entire charge of the activities, Mrs. Amundson said, following the Camp Fire program of delegating responsibilities to older girls in the program.

SEATTLE (UPI) — Mt. Everest conquerors Jim Whittaker of Redmond and Luther Jerstad of Gig Harbor are scheduled to leave here Saturday morning to keep an appointment with President Kennedy.

The climbers, accompanied by their wives, are scheduled to depart at 8:15 a.m. aboard a United Airlines plane for a flight to Friendship Airport in Baltimore. They are to talk with the President Monday, after rendezvousing with other members of the Everest party.

Whittaker was the first American to reach the summit of the world's highest mountain, making the successful climb May 1. Jerstad was one of four Americans who reached the top in later assaults on the summit.

Reedsport Council Approves Tax Levy

The Reedsport City Council has approved an ordinance setting a \$22,787.83 tax levy for the 1963-64 fiscal year of city operations. The action followed the formal budget hearing at which no remonstrances were voiced, reports Dawn Pease, correspondent.

The levy is \$855 in excess of the six per cent tax limitation, as approved by the voters at a special election. The amount in excess is caused by the interest payment on the \$25,000 library building bond issue approved by the voters.

The 1963-64 levy is about \$27,000 less than that for the 1962-63 fiscal year, City Recorder Irving Johnson pointed out. Completion of retirement of the sewer bond indebtedness resulted in a drop in general fund expenditures.

According to B. B. Brejcha, secretary, the executive board will continue to meet on the first Monday of each month during the summer.
