**Eugene Man Freed Of Perjury Count**

Edward Eugene Emerson of Eugene was acquitted of perjury, at the conclusion of a two-day trial Tuesday and Wednesday before Circuit Court Judge Charles S. Woodrich.

Emerson was charged in a Grand Jury indictment, which alleged that he lied on the stand during a trial in which he was the defendant in a District Court case involving drunken driving.

He was accused of falsely stating he was not the driver of the vehicle at the time of his arrest Jan. 31 at Myrtle Creek.

An interesting fact of the perjury trial was that District Court Judge Gerald R. Hayes who tried the drunken driving case and the six jurors who found him innocent of drunken driving were subpoenaed as witnesses. All the jurors were not called as witnesses, however.
