## Roseburg Karters Win Holiday Races

Close races highlighted the July 4th action at the Tri-City track, with Roseburg karters winning three of the six events.

The tightest competition during the afternoon came in the Group II single engines where Clarence Silvers and Bill Bearden, a pair of local drivers divided top honors. The two scored the same number of points to tie for first.

Other Roseburg first place winners were Bob Berry in Group I single engines and Glen Thomas in Group I dual engines.

Floyd Cautrell of Springfield walked off with the honors in Group II of the single engines and Grants Pass' Jerry Condray won the junior boys event.

Bearden, 53, is the oldest driver to compete in the Slo-Kart club sponsored races. Taking his kart out of mothballs for the holiday action, Bearden showed the younger drivers a few tricks.

The next kart races at the Tri-City tract will be July 14. A meeting of the Slo-Kart Club will be held July 10 at the home of Dick Hiner, club president.

If Manning is moved back to his regular centerfield slot McDonald will change to shortstop and Markham will start at second. Reserve infielder is Rick Abrahamson.

In the outfield Lockwood Motors will have Mike Blomberg in left, Manning or Tom Morrison in center and either Morrison or Wassom in right.

# Podres Pitches Dodgers To 1-0 Victory Over Reds

Lefty Johnny Podres showed three All-Star pitchers how it should be done, although he does not plan to be in Cleveland on Tuesday.

The reason he won't be there is simple. He wasn't chosen to the National League All-Star team by manager Alvin Dark.

But he certainly looked as if he should have been Friday night when he beat one All-Star pitcher and earned a richly deserved "well done" from two others in leading the Los Angeles Dodgers to a two-hit 1-0 victory over the Cincinnati Reds.

Podres bested left-hander Jim O'Toole, one of eight pitchers chosen for the NL All-Star team by Dark. And he also bettered the two most recent performances of his All-Star teammates, Sandy Koufax and Don Drysdale.

Koufax blanked the Cardinals on three hits last Wednesday night and Drysdale also whitewashed St. Louis on five hits Tuesday night but Podres was sharper than both in pitching the Dodgers to their fifth straight victory while increasing their league lead to three games.

**Howard Homers**  
 Provided with the only run he needed when Frank Howard hammered his 13th homer in the seventh inning, Podres struck out four batters and did not walk a

man en route to his sixth triumph. Tommy Harper's bad-bounce single in the fourth inning was the first hit off Podres, and Johnny Edwards' sixth inning single was the last. O'Toole allowed six hits in suffering his sixth loss against 13 triumphs.

San Francisco overcame St. Louis, 6-5, in 11 innings. Houston beat Milwaukee, 4-2. The Cubs topped the Phillies, 3-2, in 11 innings and the Pirates dealt the Mets their eighth straight loss, 3-1.

In the American League, Cleveland stopped the Yankees, 4-1, Boston beat Chicago, 8-3, Detroit downed Kansas City, 4-3, Washington defeated Los Angeles, 5-1, and Baltimore edged Minnesota, 4-3, but lost the nightcap, 7-5.

 Chuck Hiller's 11th inning single off Ed Bauta snapped a 5-5 tie between the Giants and Cardinals after San Francisco knotted the score on Harvey Kuenn's single in the ninth. Willie McCovey drove in three runs with a homer and a single. Jim Duffalo was the winner.

Bob Bruce of the Colts helped himself to his fourth victory with a double and a triple against the Braves, although rookie Jim Dickson was called into the game in the eighth to preserve Houston's third straight win. Rookie Bob Sadowski was charged with his third consecutive loss.

Andre Rodgers' sacrifice fly scored Ernie Banks with the winning run for the Cubs in the 11th inning against the Phillies. Reliever Lindy McDaniel was credited with his fifth victory, which also was the fifth in a row for the Cubs. Johnny Kippstein was the loser in relief of Ray Culp. Ruben Amaro homered for Philadelphia.

Roberto Clemente's two-run homer at the expense of Tracy Stallard in the eighth inning dissolved a 1-1 tie between the Pirates and Mets. Don Cardwell gained his fifth win with Al McBee's help in the eighth.

## Ortega Picked Over Bello 2-1

NEW YORK (UPI) — Welterweight contender Gaspar Ortega of Mexico is favored at 2-1 to beat young Billy Bello of New York tonight and spoil Billy's television and Madison Square Garden main-event debut.

Their scheduled 10-rounder will mark Bello's first attempted step toward a shot at the 147-pound crown.

Thus far brown-haired Billy, 26, has been brought along gradually by his handlers, who had arranged special instructions this year from former welterweight and middleweight champion Sugar Ray Robinson.

Left-hander Bello's 23 fights in 2 1/2 years show 17 victories, five defeats and one draw. He scored eight knockouts but never was stopped himself.

Those 23 bouts provided only one-fifth the professional experience enjoyed by Indian Ortega, only 27 but a veteran of 11 ring years. He had 115 fights, including 55 wins—40 by knockout—27 losses and three draws.
