

Myrtle Creek Council Approves Budget, Street Lighting Project

The Myrtle Creek City Council at its meeting Tuesday night accepted a total city budget of \$216,625 following a scheduled public hearing at which no citizens appeared to either protest or question the budget.

According to correspondent Loraine Birenbaum, estimated revenue is \$193,040, leaving \$23,585 to be raised by taxes. Since the amount is within the 6 per cent limitation, no vote will be needed.

In other action the council approved the Street Committee's recommendation to go ahead with a street lighting renovation program in cooperation with Pacific Power and Light Co. to provide added poles and new and larger lights at a total additional monthly cost of \$22.80.
