**Schoendienst Gets Release From Reds**

ST. LOUIS (UPI) — The playing career of former National League star second baseman Red Schoendienst presumably came to an end Monday when the St. Louis Cardinals announced they had planned to give him his unconditional release.

However, the 40-year-old Schoendienst will be retained as a coach on manager Johnny Keane's staff, the position in which he started the season with the Red Birds.

In addition, the Cardinals said they have called up infielder-outfielder Gary Kolb, who is batting .318 for Tulsa, to replace the veteran infielder.

Schoendienst was reactivated about two weeks ago for use as a pinch hitter, and in five trips to the plate this season went hitless.

**Pollard To See Action Sunday**

PORTLAND (Special) — The paved one quarter mile oval at Jantzen arena, will be the scene of two auto racing events Friday and again Sunday evening.

A huge 100 car jalopy destruction derby will be Friday's billing with the junk yard recruits smashing and erasing in eight fever bending, car-smashing events. Time trials get under way at 7:30 p.m. with the first racing event starting at 8:30. Arena gates open at 6:30 p.m.

Sunday's events will be a twilight affair with the Northwest's fastest racing cars, the Super Modified Sportsmen, holding forth with their first outing on the "short" track this season.

A classy field of the Northwest's top cars and drivers will be assaulting the oval with time trials getting under way at 6 p.m. with the first racing event set for 7 o'clock. The sleek, low slung, bullet shaped speedsters will race through eight events with a 50 lap feature, the highlight of the racing events.

Modified aces who will see action include Bullet Bob Gregg, Don Nelson, Art Pollard, Dean and Dewey Wilcock, Cliff Spaulding, Billy Foster, Eldon Linder and Jim Roberts.

**Rodgers In Lead At British Open**

LYTHAM-ST. ANNES, England (UPI) — Phil Rodgers, 25-year-old pro from La Jolla, Calif., shot a three-under-par 67 to take the early first-round lead in the British Open golf championship today while favored Arnold Palmer floundered to a 76.

Rodgers, rated by British experts as a "dark-horse" in the tournament went out in two-under-par 32 and came back in one-under-par 35 in the cold wind and intermittent showers that greeted the first day's play on the Royal Lytham and St. Annes course.

Doug Sanders of Ojai, Calif., and Herman Barron, the world seniors professional champion from White Plains, N.Y., each carded a 36-29-75, and Jack Isaacs of Langley Field, Va., shot a 38-38-76.

Jack Nicklaus of Columbus, Ohio, and Bob Marshall of Huntington Beach, Calif., were among those who teed off late.

Palmer, who has won the past two British Open championships and is a 2 to 1 favorite to repeat this year, lost a stroke to par when he went out in 35 and shot a wretched five-over-par 81 on the incoming nine holes. He took double bogeys on the 12th and 17th holes.

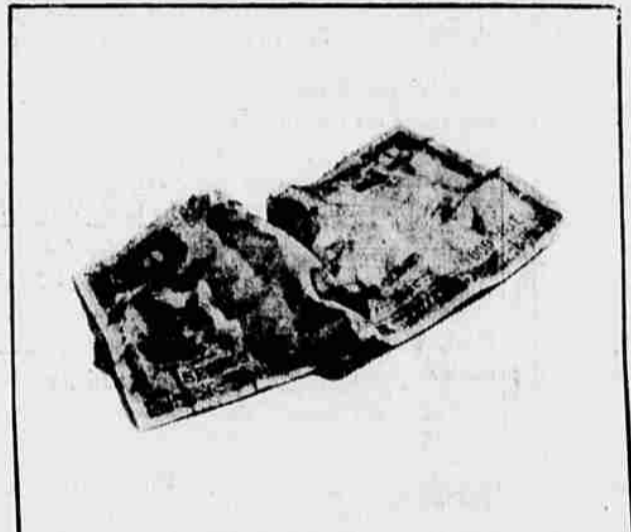
Rodgers, whose only major tournament victory this season was in the Texas Open, shot birdies on the second, 8th and 11th holes and never strayed over par

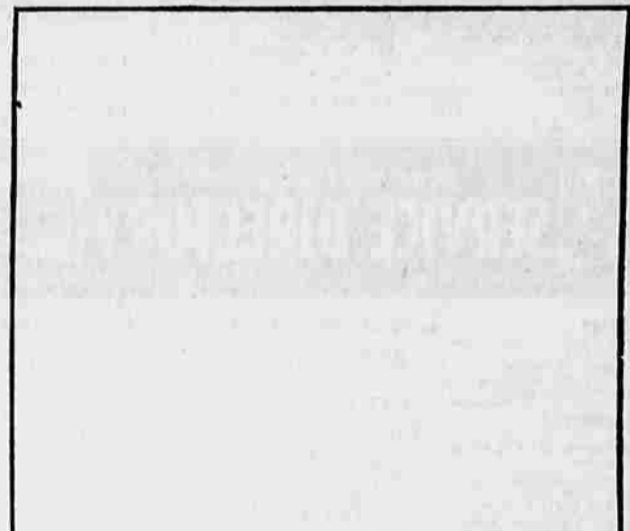
