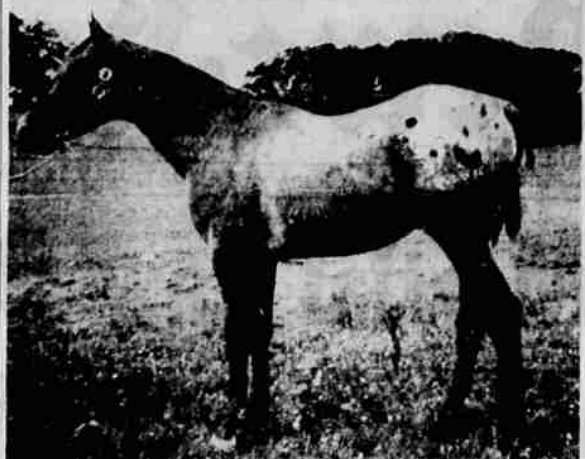

Committee members Fred Bernau, Forrest Kennaday and Mrs. Donald Brown presented a resume of the meeting with the board, then answered specific questions from the gathering in a question and answer session.

The major topic of discussion centered around the recent resignation of High School principal John Thompson. In an interview with Thompson, the committee members reported, he had stated that discipline problems with the teachers was a factor behind his resignation, but was just one of several. The primary reason listed in Thompson's official resignation was that of advancement in his chosen career. Thompson resigned as principal at Glide High School to become principal at Scappoose.
