

Monboquette Continues To Baffle Opponents, Stops Minnesota, 2-0

Bill Monboquette became a star pitcher when he learned to curb his temper. So now it's the Boston Red Sox American League rivals who feel like tossing tantrums.

The fiery, 26-year-old Frenchman from Medford, Mass., is controlling his temper and his curvball so well this year that he (1) is the first major league pitcher to beat every rival team this season and (2) figures to be the Red Sox' first 20-game winner since 1953.

At the same time he's playing a major role in keeping the Red Sox within shouting distance of the first-place New York Yankees in the AL race.

Monboquette completed the cycle — beating every rival team — Thursday night when he pitched a three-hitter that gave the Red Sox a 2-0 victory over the Minnesota Twins. Bob Tillman and Eddie Bressoud homered in the third and eighth innings to produce the Red Sox' runs.

The Yankees maintained their five-game lead with a 3-2 10-inning win over the Los Angeles Angels. The Chicago White Sox topped the Detroit Tigers, 6-3, the Cleveland Indians downed the Kansas City Athletics, 8-6, and the Baltimore Orioles beat the Washington Senators, 7-4, in other AL games.

Monboquette struck out 17 batters in a game in 1961 and pitched a no-hitter in 1962 but is en route to by far his best season in the majors. He struck out eight and walked only one to best Dick Stigman. Mel Farnell, who turned the trick in 1953, was the last Red Sox 20-game winner.

Whitey Ford gained credit for his 10th straight win and 14th of the season when Joe Pepitone's double and Elston Howard's single snapped a 2-2 tie in the 10th. Hal Reniff retired the Angels in the bottom of the frame, sealing Los Angeles' ninth straight loss.

Mike Hershberger's two-run triple and Jim Landis' two-run triple featured a six-run third inning that enabled the White Sox to remain five games behind the Yankees. Jim Brosnan retired pinch-hitter

Gabe Brown with two out in the ninth to preserve Gary Peters' sixth win. George Thomas had a pair of hits for the Tigers.

Johnny Wyatt walked in the tie-breaking run and wild-pitched an insurance run home to cap Cleveland's three-run eighth-inning rally. Willie Kirkland homered for the Indians and George Alusik, Ken Harrelson and Doc Edwards connected for the Athletics.

The Orioles ended the Senators' seven-game winning streak with a six-run seventh inning in which Al Smith doubled and Jim Gentile, Brooks Robinson, Jackie Brandt and Russ Snyder singled. Dick Hall, who pitched one inning, got credit for his fourth win while Ron Kline suffered his fourth setback.

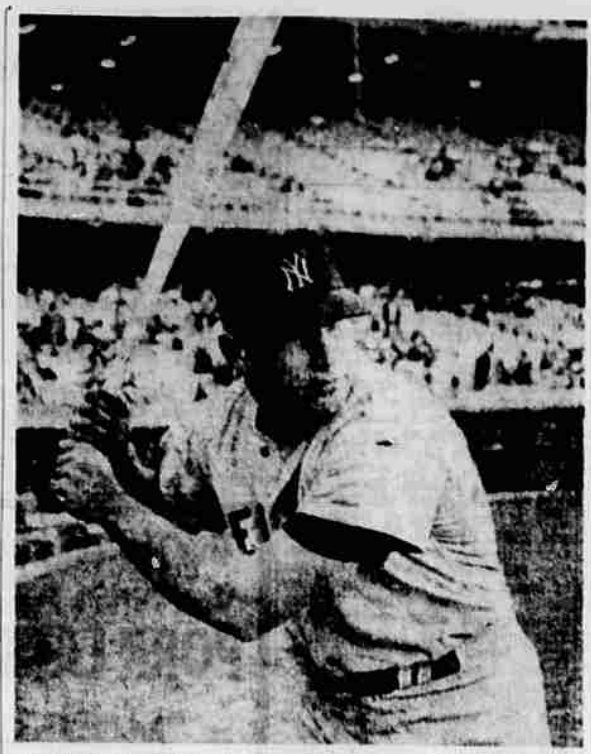

Billy G., Earl Johnson Signed For City Of Roses Tournament

The entry advance list for the \$20,500 City of Roses Open professional bowling tournament took another jump today with the announcement from professional bowlers headquarters in Akron, Ohio, of 12 more stars definitely signed for a September appearance in Portland.

The new list of pro kegglers is led by Earl Johnson, former Tacoma bowler, presently in fourth place in the PBA money standings, and Billy Golembiewski, or "Billy G.," as everybody calls him, one of the nation's perennial top pin blasters.

Johnson, now rolling out of Minneapolis, won the Schenectady Open in June and finished second in the Canadian Open last month, to jump to a total of \$16,030 in winnings in PBA tournaments this year. Mrs. Cook, like all good teachers, stresses the code word "Arch"

both in dummy play and defense. "A" stands for "Analyze the Lead," "R" for "Review the bidding," "C" for "Count your winners and losers," and "H" for "How can I make or beat the contract?"

Mrs. Cook points out that against any lead but a diamond, South will knock out the ace of trumps and eventually lead diamonds from dummy to end up losing one trump one diamond and one club.

She points out further that the beginner will have no trouble with a diamond lead. He will simply win the first trick and go after trumps. West will get in the lead with the ace, but won't be able to get a
