80 Gals Entered In U.S. Air Trek

BAKERSFIELD, Calif. (UPI)—At 20 second intervals, some 45 planes began taking off from Meadows Field here (starting at 8 a.m. PDT—11 a.m. EDT) today in the only race of its kind—the All Woman Transcontinental air race.

Better known as the "Powder Puff Derby," the race is now in its 17th consecutive year and is the only transcontinental air race currently being run.

Mrs. Judy Wagner, Palos Verdes, Calif., won the draw for the starting position and will take off first, followed by Mrs. Bertha Haycock of Bakersfield and then Mrs. Alice Hammond of Meadowbrook, Pa.

More than 80 women from 20 states are entered in this year's race with more than one third of them competing for the first time.

All of them arrived here last weekend and early this week to subject their aircraft to stringent inspection by Federal Aviation Agency (FAA) authorities who won't allow the derby planes off the ground unless they meet every specification in the book.

One craft, a new Beechcraft Musketeer 23 piloted by Pat Wilson of Bedminster, N. J., and co-piloted by Selma Cronan of Leonia, N. J., was almost scratched early this week when its propeller measured just 1/8 inch too short.

Russ Defector Has Revealed Many Secret Agent Names

LONDON (UPI)—The high-ranking Soviet spy who defected 18 months ago has given the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) in Washington the names of many—if not all—Russian secret agents working in the West, informed sources said today.

The source said the master spy also has tipped the CIA to the methods employed by the Communist agents. Many Soviet agents have been recalled behind the Iron Curtain in recent months.

Reports said the defector will assume a new identity in Britain in an attempt to prevent Russian agents from murdering him to demonstrate the power of the Communist spy apparatus. It is too late to keep him from talking.

The Guardian, quoting French sources, said the spy "will soon emerge with a new personality, name and background."

The identity of the intelligence officer was divulged today in the British press despite a government request to withhold publication of his name.

Disgruntled Mountaineers Raid Strange Camp For Young People

ROSMAN, N.C. (UPI)—Mountain folk stewed for days about the strange camp where, it was said, people wore no clothes, worshipped no god and never got a haircut.

The teen-aged campers "have long hair and sexy clothes and sometimes they wear no clothes at all," one mountaineer grumbled.

Some said free love was being taught at the camp, and others reported seeing youngsters swimming naked in a lake.

Last week the mountaineers got so disgruntled they sent a council of six citizens out to the camp and got assurances that the campers would stay away from Rosman.

But then some of the campers came into town, and word got around that there were Negroes at the camp, called Summerlane.

This, officials said today, was the last straw for the local folk. About 400 mountaineers went into the camp, burned down the gymnasium, threw gasoline on the lake which was reported used for nude bathing and set it afire, and rioted for nearly five hours.

The fracas started Thursday night and ended about 3 a.m. Friday. Cudfire shattered the window of a bus, abandoned by the campers. One man was stabbed but was not seriously injured. There were no arrests.

In New York, a spokesman for the campers, Skip Weatherford, said that when the townsfolk stormed the camp "the Rev. George Van Hishmer and 15 other male and female counselors had, protected and calmed the 55 children."

The children ranged in age from infants to 16-year-olds.

Discoverer Of Controversial Drug Removes Application

CHICAGO (UPI)—The most bitterly fought medical battle of the decade took a dramatic turn Friday when the discoverer of krebiozen withdrew his application for continued experimental status of the drug.

The move, in effect, meant at least a temporary halt in efforts to win federal approval of the controversial cancer drug and put it on the market.

Dr. Stevan Durovic, a refugee Yugoslav physician who first extracted the substance from the blood serum of horses 16 years ago, withdrew his application in a letter to Anthony J. Celebrezze, secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW).

He said the government had waged a fight against "an unbiased clinical test" of the drug with "unheard-of pressure, the spreading of false statements to the press, an attempt to frame me and now an attempt to indict me."

He told Celebrezze he had "lost hope that your department will ever solve this controversy in good faith."

The latest attempts to secure an evaluation of krebiozen from the National Cancer Institute (NCI) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) bogged down in a welter of charges and counter-charges.

Federal officials maintained that information provided by the drug's sponsors was inadequate for a thorough test. Durovic and Dr. Andrew C. Ivy, who has virtually staked his professional career on his support of the drug, maintained they submitted adequate information.

Krebiozen has long been opposed by the American Medical Association (AMA), which maintains the drug is worthless in the treatment of cancer.

Ivy is perhaps the one person most caught up in the krebiozen controversy. A physiologist of considerable repute, he lost his post as vice president of the University of Illinois where he first tested the drug and found it had "merit."

Roseburg Church Sets Week-Long Bible Course

The Church of Christ on Garden Valley Blvd. has scheduled a week of concentrated Bible study beginning Monday, July 15, according to A. L. Lemley, church spokesman. Sessions will run through Sunday, July 21, with special all-day services on that date and also on this Sunday, July 14.

Classes will be held from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. and from 7:45 p.m. to 9 p.m. on weekdays. Sack lunches will be served at 1 p.m. and at 6:45 p.m. potluck dinners will be held at Stewart Park prior to the evening classes.

Main subject for the course will be "Bible Reading and Study," directed by Otis Daniel of Upland, Calif. Evangelist Leon Garrett of Olivehurst, Calif., will be in charge of study of word usage as found in the King James version of the Bible. Oregon Posted 50,000 New Signs In '62 To Keep Motoring Public On Right Road

It required 50,000 new highway traffic signs to keep Oregon's motoring public on the right road during 1962. This many signs were built and installed on the 7,500-mile Oregon highway system last year, according to Forrest Cooper, state highway engineer.

The sign division of the state Highway Department also painted more than 260 different types of legends. The signs range from the temporary types used at detours to large permanent types for freeways. Sign men also painted numerous legends on pavements. The largest of these has letters 8.5 feet high. These are at the state borders and read "Welcome to Oregon."

Larger signs are used on modern highways because they are necessary on the high-speed freeways. A motorist must be able to read the sign, understand it and act upon it in a matter of seconds while traveling at 60 or 70 miles an hour.

Highway signs range in size from the 12-inch Oregon route marker to the 28-foot signs suspended over freeways. The price range is from \$15 to approximately \$20,000 for the largest, including installation costs.

Most highway signs are made of plywood or aluminum. Average life of the plywood sign is five to seven years. Letters and numbers on the reflectorized aluminum signs must be cleaned about every five years.

Vandalism to signs costs the highway department an estimated \$50,000 each year. Some signs are flattened by vehicles but most of the damage is done during the hunting season and during the summer months when road signs become targets for rifles, shotguns, bottles and rocks, Cooper said.
