**Gearhart Legislator Heads Legislative Highway Group**  
 SALEM (UPI)—The nine-member Legislative Highway Interim Committee met Saturday and elected Rep. William Holmstrom, D-Gearhart, as chairman.  
 It was the second of the 1963 interim committees to organize, and the second to name a representative as chairman.  
 The wildlife interim group organized here Friday, and named Rep. W. O. Kelsay, D-Roseburg, as chairman.  
 Sen. R. F. Chapman, D-Coos Bay, was named vice chairman, and Rep. Robert Smith, R-Burns, was elected secretary.  
 Other committee members, all of whom were present for today's organizational session, include Reps. Carl Back, D-Port Orford, Norman Howard, D-Portland, Ken Maher, R-Portland, and Sens. Edward Fadeley, D-Eugene, John Inskip, R-Oregon City, and Anthony Yturri, R-Ontario.  
 The group authorized Holmstrom to hire a full time committee clerk, but decided against hiring an executive secretary.  
 Traditionally the highway group does not hire an executive secretary because it has the facilities of the highway and motor vehicle departments, the League of Oregon Cities, and the Association of Oregon Counties at its disposal.  
 Back said it might be wise to hire an executive secretary who was not "involved" with the agencies the committee will work with.  
 Holmstrom opposed Back's suggestion and he's rather have committee members do more of the work themselves.  
 Major items to be surveyed during the interim include a study of the source and distribution of motor vehicle revenues, allocation of highway funds to cities and counties, tourism, and methods of expanding the tourist economy, the possibility of using freeway center strips for rapid transit facilities, gasoline tax revenues collected from boaters, and a study of the purchase and sale of lands along highways.

**COMMUNIST TROOPS HIT Neutral Laos Forces**  
 VIENTIANE, Laos (UPI)—Communist Pathet Lao troops, supported by artillery and machinegun fire, were reported today to have launched an attack on neutralist forces entrenched southeast of the Plain of Jars airstrip.  
 Neutralist military sources here said the Communists fired 70 rounds of shells Sunday night at neutralist positions about two miles southeast of the airstrip.  
 The sources added that Pathet Lao infantry supported by medium machinegun fire, launched an attack against the neutralists. There were no immediate reports of casualties.
