

Eaton Captures Featured Hardtop Duel; Dykstra Dominates Jalopies

The top three returned to form Saturday night at the Roseburg Speedway to grab off the first three places in the 30-lap hardtop A-Main event.

Jay Eaton, last year's driving champ, came through with a first place finish as he nipped Jim Standley and Don Hein in a thriller. Standley finished second and Hein ended third. The trio are all from Roseburg.

(Rocky) Ford Plant and Hal Welker emerged as the victors in the hardtop heat races, while Jim Holeman won the B-Trophy Dash and Standley took the honors in the A-Trophy Dash. Eaton circled the track in a blazing 15.67 seconds to record the fast time of the evening.

In the jalopy competition Vern Dykstra dominated the field. Dykstra won the Jalopy Trophy Dash, the second heat race and the 25-lap main event. Bob Johnson won the first heat race.

Several crashes marred the action. Among the most spectacular was Don Nuzum's in the B Trophy dash. Nuzum hit the cement retaining wall while leading the field with about 50 feet remaining to the finish line. His car was put out of action for the remainder of the night.

Holeman, driving in competition for the first time, sailed over the bank in the first turn of the first lap of the A Main, losing a front wheel and nearly totalling his car. The race was started over and on the sixth lap Lonny Ledbetter went off the track on the same turn.

Roseburg Bees Divide Pair Against Cottage Grove

Turning on the power in the seventh inning of the second game, the Roseburg Bees pushed across a single run to escape with a split against the invading Cottage Grove Lions Sunday in a doubleheader at Legion Field.

Cottage Grove, a member of the Summer High School League in Lane County, handed the Bees their second loss of the season in the opener, 10-9. Roseburg's second Legion contingent came back in the second outing to even the score by eking out a 3-2 triumph.

The opening contest was touch-and-go until the invaders exploded for five runs in the fifth inning.

Roseburg managed to pick up a single counter in the sixth to get back within one run of the Lions, but could not come up with the equalizer.

Walks to Jerry Ross and Jeff Richards, and a single by Chuck Olds put the invaders out in front by one in the opening frame. However, Roseburg came back with two runs in its half of the first inning. Dan Withes was hit by the pitcher, and Chuck Person and Mike Cashner drew walks to load the bases. A walk to Stan Young tied the game and Person raced home on a passed ball. Ray Shepherd walked to load the sacks

once again and Cashner scored when Jim Kiser's grounder was bobbled.

Cottage Grove tied the score in the second frame with two hits and a pair of Roseburg errors, then took a two run lead in the top of the fourth.

The local crew bounced back with five runs in the bottom of the fourth. Charles Dornisafe was safe on an error and Pat Long slapped a single to start the rally. Withes provided the power with a double. Jim Coon was safe on an error and Cashner drew a free pass before Young singled. An error on Shepherd's grounder kept the rally going before a ground out and a strike out ended the uprising.

However, the explosion by the Bees was not enough as Cottage Grove roared back into the lead with a five-run explosion of its own in the top of the fifth. Three singles, two errors, a walk and Ross' triple accounted for the winning rally.

Cashner scored the final run for Roseburg as he led off the sixth with a walk, stole second, went to third on a wild pitch and scored on another wild pitch.

Withes tied the Bees at the plate with two singles and a double in four appearances, while Ross had

a perfect 3-3 record for the Lions. In the second game Cottage Grove took a 2-0 lead with single runs in the second and fourth innings before the local nine got started. The Bees tied the count in the bottom of the fourth.

With two away Young drew a walk and Shepherd followed with a booming triple. Shepherd came across with the tying run when Gary Heeter's grounder was muffed.

The winning run for the Bees came in the bottom of the seventh. Kiser, pinch hitting, led off with

a free pass, then was moved around to score the winning run on three consecutive singles.
