

Message To A Widow Of Viet Nam Fighter

EDITORS' NOTE: The official record states that Capt. Condon Hunter Terry, U.S. Air Force, was killed June 27, with his Vietnamese pilot during a strafing run against Communist rebels in Viet Nam. This is a message to his widow in Dallas.

BIEN HOA, Viet Nam (UPI) — Maybe it will ease your grief a bit, Audrey Terry, to know that Connie suffered no pain.
The enemy ground fire that downed his plane June 27 apparently killed him and his Vietnamese pilot instantly.
There's probably a bit of bitterness mixed with your grief because a 20-year-old husband and father of two boys like Condon Hunter Terry III and Dennis Wade should die at a place like Can Tho, thousands of miles away from Dallas.

Network Invites Rock-Barry Debate

NEW YORK (UPI) — Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller and Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., have been invited by the Columbia Broadcasting System (CBS) to exchange their views in a television debate.

Richard S. Salant, president of CBS News, sent telegrams to the two Republicans Tuesday, offering them an hour of air time on July 24, Aug. 7 or Aug. 21.
A spokesman said today the network has not received replies from either Rockefeller or Goldwater.

In extending the invitation, Salant suggested the debate center on "appropriate policies and directions for the Republican party in 1964."

Simmering dissension within the GOP burst to the surface last Sunday when Rockefeller warned that the "radical right lunatic branch" might all but destroy the party.

He also expressed the fear that Goldwater, a leading candidate for the 1964 presidential nomination, will become a "captive" candidate of the extreme right wing factions.

The Arizona conservative's supporters promptly reported that the attack was Rockefeller's way of declaring his own candidacy for the nomination.

is an awfully young time to die. But you know Connie, that from the day he graduated from Texas A&M, he was a professional military man who loved flying and the Air Force more than anything except his family.

Along with your grief today there should be pride—for you now and for young Connie and Dennis later—in the kind of man Connie was and the way he died. Some of your well-meaning friends have probably told you it was a shame Connie had to come away over here and fight and die in this nasty mess without even having the satisfaction he was fighting an officially recognized war.

Maybe it was a shame, Audrey, but lots of women know it wasn't any easier having their men killed in the "official" war of the forties or the "police action" of the fifties. The blow is just as stupefying; the grief just as terrible.

And Connie died fighting a war, Audrey; a war just as important as Korea, the ETO, or the Pacific. Maybe it is a shadow war, maybe the humbugged diplomats have their reasons for insisting that Connie was here merely as an "adviser." That's unimportant. The important thing was Connie knew why he was here, what he was doing and why he was doing it—it was his duty and his job and he did it well.

If you're confused, Audrey, about Connie's being here, think of Le Hoai Son's family. He was Connie's pilot and died with him when their T28 crashed during Thursday's strafing run.

He was killed by one of his own countrymen—maybe even a relative—in this fighting which has been going on in Viet Nam for more than 15 years. Wars are like that, Audrey. Remember we had one of our own in the 1860's. The thing to remember in your hours of grief, Audrey, is what his fellow pilots in the First Air Commando Group thought of Connie. They all came to the little green chapel in Saigon for the memorial service, white and colored, lieutenants, colonels, corporals and PFCs—some in sun tan khakis and some in slacks. And even though Connie had been over there only a month, they enjoyed him as a friend, respected him as a pilot and admired him as a man.

Tractor Mishap Claims Brothers

KLAMATH FALLS (UPI)—Two teen-age brothers drowned when a tractor on which they were riding overturned into an irrigation canal 12 miles southeast of here Tuesday.

The victims were Terry High, 14, and Martin High, 12, sons of Mr. and Mrs. Taylor High. High is a well-known Klamath County rancher.

The boys were riding the tractor along a road on the canal bank, which parallels the water, when the vehicle slipped and plunged into eight feet of water.

He started all right by winning the heart opening and leading out his ace of trumps, but he continued with the jack of trumps. West took his queen and later on South had to lose two more trump tricks and a club.

South should have followed his ace of spades with a low one. West would still take his queen, but South could play his jack of spades later on and eventually pick up East's nine spot with the ten.

Why was South's unfortunate result due to bad play and not to luck? Because South had nothing to gain by leading the jack of spades after taking his ace. Should trumps break 3-3, he was only going to lose two spade tricks on any play. Should either defender hold four to the king-queen South would have to lose three trump tricks, but if either opponent held queen-small or king-small then the low play would save that all-important contract.

Syria, Iraq In Political Conflict With Nasser

BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI)—Signs have appeared of a possible rising tide against the Baath party control in Syria and Iraq, both locked in a bitter ideological conflict with U.A.R.'s President Gamal Abdel Nasser.

Syria is now deep in a political crisis which has seen its Baath government maneuver repeatedly to avoid an open clash with the non-Baathists.

Iraq recently announced the crushing of "a vile Communist plot," but the reports reaching here indicate that the plotters were by no means only Communist.

In both Iraq and Syria observers believe the trouble stems from Baath insistence on placing its own men—however inexperienced—in key positions.

This policy is claimed to be fostering a steadily increasing anti-Baath attitude in the civil service and the armed forces, where seniority has sometimes been ignored.

Had Strong Following
The Syrian crisis began last month with a Baathist bid to clip the wings of Defense Minister Ziad Al Hariri, a man with a strong personal following in the army, by transferring abroad or

discharging a number of his close army associates.

Hariri battled the move bitterly. But the National Revolutionary Council stripped Hariri of his post and sent him to European exile July 8.

The failure of the Baath to grant adequate representation to Syrian Nasserite elements in the post-coup cabinet sparked the crisis and put in doubt the establishment of the tripartite United Arab federation of Iraq, Syria and Egypt.

The reasons for the clash are complex. Both support Arab nationalism and Arab unity but they differ diametrically on who should lead this part of the world.

Factor In Uprising
No such figure as Hariri yet exists in Iraq. But there the anger against the "Baathisation" of the army appears to have been a major factor in the recent brief uprising at the strategic El Rashid military camp outside Bagdad, according to reports received here through diplomatic channels.

Dist. Atty. George Van Hoomissen said a murder charge was not considered because there was no evidence that Oye died as a result of the assault. An autopsy showed he suffered a heart attack. He was found dead several days after the assault allegedly occurred.

The camp contains a large number of Communist and Kurdish prisoners, and the reports claim that most of these were released and armed by dissident army units in preparation for a march on Bagdad.

Something like two-thirds of the Iraqi army is presently engaged in the campaign against the Kurds' nationalists in the north.

Any serious trouble in the remaining units could face the Baath administration with a serious danger.

In both Syria and Iraq there is also discontent among the business communities, whose activities have been virtually stalled as a result of future uncertainties arising out of the Baath-Nasser crisis.

PORTLAND (UPI)—Five Gresham area youths were indicted by the Multnomah County grand jury Tuesday on charges of assault with intent to rob.

The youths are Arthur Clunie and Charles Hancock, both 16, and Gary Luther, Paul Schoenborn and Lawrence Tibbett, all 17.

The boys were taken into custody after the death of Benzo Oye, a 78-year-old Japanese national, at Gresham June 22.
