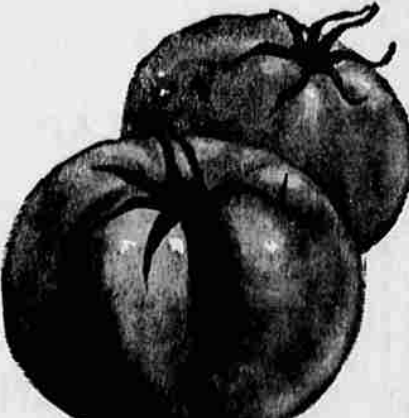

Pine Grove Church Books Ex-Resident As Sunday Speaker

A young missionary who once attended Dixonville Elementary School will return to the area as guest speaker at 11 o'clock services Sunday at the Pine Grove Church in Dixonville. He is Richard Denham, missionary to Brazil.

Denham, an independent missionary, has worked on the Amazon river for the past ten years, reaching people in the interior by launch and carrying on additional work by radio. At present he is in charge of the Christian book store at Manaus, Brazil, which is a city of over 100,000 population 1,000 miles up the Amazon river in the heart of the jungle area.

Denham began his education in Dixonville and lived in the area with his parents for six years. His mother, Mrs. Pearl Denham, is also a missionary and is managing the book store in Manaus while her son and family are on furlough.

This week Denham and his two older children are at Camp Fir Point Bible Conference. His wife and two younger children are visiting at Coos Bay.

The public is invited to the special service Sunday.

Sen. Morse Raps Newspaper Critics

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Wayne Morse, D-Ore., lashed out recently at newspaper criticism of his role in finding a use for the abandoned Tongue Point Naval Station, and he said the low bids submitted for the property recently make it more important that a federal use be found for the site.

But Morse emphasized that if the federal government decides it does not want to use the base, he will "do everything I can" to help Oregon business interests obtain the property for private industrial development.

Morse earlier this year described a plan by the city of Astoria to buy the property for \$920,000 and resell it to a private industrial corporation for \$950,000 as a "steal."

In a Senate statement Monday, he quoted the administrator of the General Services Administration as saying the GSA could not abuse its negotiating authority by taking part in such a deal.

Morse castigated the Portland Oregonian "and similar newspapers suffering from moral myopia," for criticizing him after he came out against the plan.

The GSA then put the naval station site up for bids June 24, with the understanding that it would not be sold at least until September.

Only six bids were received on the various parcels, and none on the entire base. The GSA has not yet acted on them.

"Just a few days ago, the President assured me again that a most thorough survey of possible federal uses of the Tongue Point property is being made by federal officials," the Oregon Democrat said.

"Government use would undoubtedly provide the state with the greatest amount of economic return in the form of jobs and economic expansion in the Astoria area."

Oakland Church Youth Book Holy Land Talk
