

## Little Chance Held For Settlement Of Rails Dispute

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Little hope was expressed today for a voluntary 11th-hour settlement of the deadlocked rail work rules dispute despite a new appeal by President Kennedy.

The special presidential fact-finding board sent copies of a draft report on the dispute to union and management representatives today. Labor Secretary W. Willard Wirtz planned to present the final report to the President Friday.

At his news conference Wednesday the President urged both sides to reach a settlement between themselves to avoid a crippling railroad strike that would hit the "national economy and interest."

But Kennedy conceded he had no reports from Wirtz that would lead him to expect such a negotiated settlement before Monday, when he tosses the whole affair to Congress.

Despite reported private efforts of members of the fact-finding board to mediate the dispute, there appeared to be no move today by the unions or management to get together.

The railroad companies have said that legislation is "the only remaining means we can see of heading off a calamitous nationwide rail strike."

Barring a last-minute agreement, the President plans to submit legislative recommendations to Congress Monday on the basis of his board's report of the facts of the four-year-old controversy. The board completed its draft paper late Wednesday.

Both sides have agreed to postpone until July 29 any action that might lead to a rail strike. The unions intend to walk out the moment the railroads impose the new work rules, which would eliminate the jobs of 37,000 firemen.

# Rockefeller Is Out To Stop Republican Conservatives

ALBANY, N.Y. (UPI) — Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller is out to stop Sen. Barry Goldwater, leading conservative contender for the 1964 Republican presidential nomination.

Rockefeller, an aide said, has known Goldwater many years and likes the Arizona senator personally. He calls him "my good friend Barry." But, he feels Goldwater carries a heavy conservative label that could sink GOP congressional candidates next year.

### Captive of Right

The governor, himself a potential White House nominee, said it is likely that if nominated Goldwater would become a "captive" of the "radical right lunatic branch" trying to gain control of the GOP.
