

Legion Bees Edge Coos Bay By 6-5 In Thriller Here

Daring base running and wild throwing in the bottom of the ninth inning provided plenty of action for the fans — in addition to giving the Roseburg Bees with a come-from-behind victory Friday.

The Bees, down by a single run going into the bottom of the ninth, rallied for two runs without the aid of a base blow to nip the invading Al Pierce Lumber Co. team of Coos Bay by a 6-5 count.

Jim Kiser, pinch-hitting for winning pitcher Rusty Hubbard, led off the ninth for Roseburg with a free pass. Doug Matson went in to run for Kiser and took second base on a passed ball. Dan Withers was safe when the Coos Bay first baseman let a pop fly drop beside him, setting the scene for some wild action.

Chuck Person lofted a fly to fairly deep center field, with Matson tagging up and heading for third after the catch. When the relay to the shortstop was bobbled Matson ran for the plate. The shortstop whirled and threw after recovering the ball, but the sphere got by the catcher, who raced back and threw low to the pitcher covering the base. By this time Withers was rounding third and heading home. The first baseman recovered and threw to the catcher, but again the throw was wide of the mark and Withers slid in with the winning run.

Roseburg had taken an early lead in the contest when three runs scored in the second frame. Charles Dornisole led off with a single and Jim Coon blasted a triple to drive in the first run. Coon scored on a ground out before a walk to Withers and Person's double accounted for the final tally.

The invaders picked up a pair of runs in the fourth inning. A walk to Terry Falls and Doug Inman and singles by John Briggs and Zane Hoffman, in the top of the sixth Coos Bay took the lead with two more runs. John Meecham and Hoffman drew back-to-back walks and Hal Smith singled to bring home one runner.

At this point Rusty Hubbard took over for Pete Woodworth on the

mound for the Bees. Roger Gould grounded out as the first batter to face Hubbard, but on the play at first Hoffman scored.

The Bees bounced back to tie the score on a walk and a throwing error in the bottom of the sixth, only to see Hoffman and Gould collect singles for the Al Pierce team in the eighth to give it a one-run edge going into the final stanza.

Hubbard, who came on in the sixth inning, was credited with the victory for Roseburg. Hubbard struck out two, walked one and gave up two hits in three and two thirds innings. Woodworth was tagged for three hits, walked four, hit one batter and struck out six.

Dornisole collected two singles for a perfect 2-2 record at the plate, while Hoffman had two hits for Coos Bay.

The victory was the seventh triumph for the Bees in nine starts. Sunday coach Jerry Droscher will take his team to Albany to play a 1 p.m. doubleheader with the Albany Merchants.

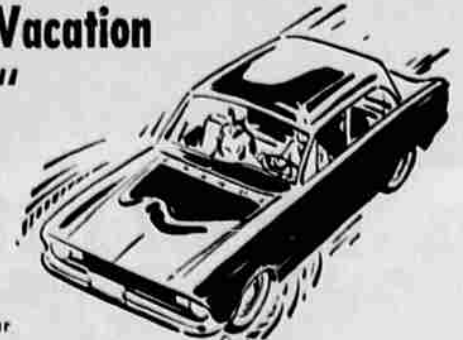

Lock Hits, Fields Brilliantly To Set Stage For Washington's 11th Win In 14 Games

Quick now, what's the hottest team in the American League?

No it isn't the New York Yankees' recent run to the Washington Senators who are in 10th place, a mere 23 games behind the world champions.

The Senators have won 11 of their 14 games this month for a .786 percentage that makes manager Gil Hodges look like a genius even if it doesn't make Washington, D.C., the baseball capital of the world.

The Senators scored their third victory in four games Friday night when they nipped the Minnesota Twins 6-3 on the strength of the hitting and fielding heroics of centerfielder Don Lock. Lock drove in the winning run with a two-out single in the top of the 13th inning and then robbed Bob Allison of a homer with a leaping catch in the bottom of the frame.

A total of 40 players saw action in the four-hour and 23-minute game with Claude Osteen, the fifth Washington pitcher, winning his fourth game and Jim Perry, the seventh Minnesota pitcher, losing his sixth. Harmon Killebrew

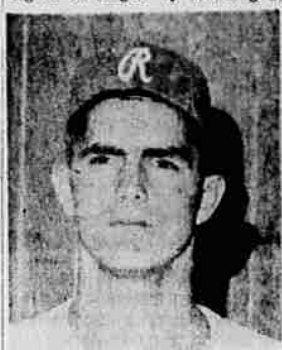

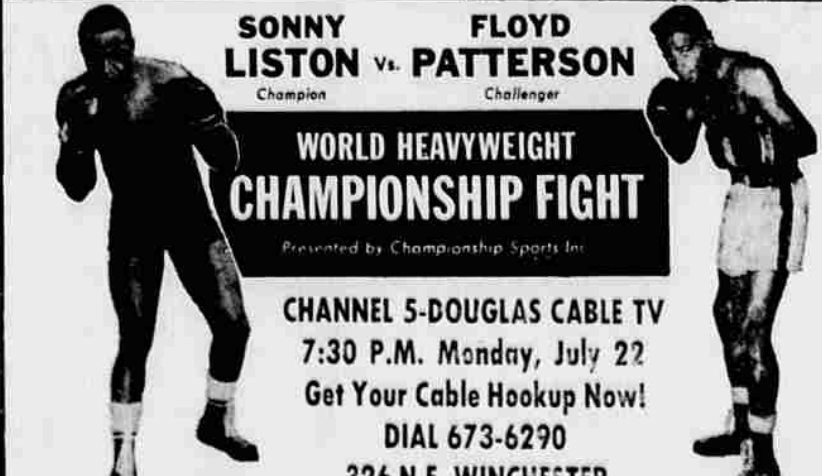
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
