Avo Pauline vs. Leslie Ward Winters. Married at Roseburg Sept. 8, 1951. Cruelty charged. Plaintiff asks custody of four minor children and \$40 monthly support for each. Plaintiff asks award of 1959 station wagon and household furnishings, with 1953 station wagon, boat and motor, sporting and camping equipment and four lots of land in Empire going to defendant.
Ronald P. vs. Colleen R. Nygaard. Married at Goldendale, Wash., Sept. 9, 1957. Cruelty charged. Plaintiff asks custody of their three minor children and award of house located at 153 SE Lane St., and household furnishings.
Sylvia Jeanette vs. Lewis Burton Biddlecome Jr. Married at Riddle Aug. 19, 1961. Cruelty charged. Plaintiff asks divorce, attorney fees and suit costs.
Clyde Gerald vs. Helen Janet Hastings. Married at Crescent City, Calif., July 6, 1949. Cruelty charged. Plaintiff would award custody of their two minor children to defendant and pay \$100 monthly for their support. Defendant to pay obligations.
Rose Marie vs. John W. Powell Jr. Married in Roseburg Sept. 10, 1954. Cruelty charged. Plaintiff asks custody of four minor children and \$35 monthly support for each. She also asks award of household furnishings.
Robert B. vs. Veldta Joan Caudill. Married in Salem Sept. 3, 1960. Cruelty charged. Plaintiff asks that each retain their personal possessions, and that defendant's maiden name of Veldta Joan Haskell be restored.
Willia Neoma vs. William Hadley Garden. Married at Columbus, Kan., April 22, 1932. Cruelty charged. Plaintiff asks custody of four minor children.
Divorce Decrees
Doreen Opal from Vernon Harry Bratsch. Plaintiff awarded custody of four minor children and \$50 monthly support for each. Defendant to pay plaintiff \$400 as part of division of property. Property settlement agreement ratified. Plaintiff awarded defendant's right in real property listed as north half of Lot 13, Dunham subdivision, subject to existing mortgage.
Ethel Mae from Lyle Henry Stout. Plaintiff awarded custody of minor child and \$50 monthly support. Complaint
Anna Lindsey, administratrix of the estate of Angela Crowser, vs. Southern Pacific Co. and Francis Kelly. Plaintiff demands judgment against the defendants for \$20,000 for the death, resulting from injuries, of Angela Crowser, July 30, 1961. She was a passenger in an automobile being operated in a westerly direction on Garden Valley Road. The accident occurred at the intersection with the railroad track. Negligence is charged against the defendant Southern Pacific and its engineer Kelly.
State of Oregon by its Highway Commission, composed of Glenn L. Jackson, Kenneth N. Fridley and David B. Simpson, vs. Frank A. and Bessie C. Smith. Suit to condemn portions of real property of defendants comprising all of lot 15 and part of lot 14, block 33 of U. S. Park Addition to Roseburg. Property is listed as needed for widening a portion of the Sutherland-Shady Section of the Pacific Highway. Also listed are lots 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20, block 33, with listed exceptions. Easement for pipe line asked, and also that there be no access from the property directly to the highway. State offers \$300 for the property.
Eugene Tractor & Implement Co. vs. John Aaron Caudill Jr. Plaintiff demands judgment from defendant for \$1,170, plus interest and \$500 attorney fees, as a sum alleged due on a promissory note dated Jan. 24, 1963.

TRACTORS BREAK DOWN

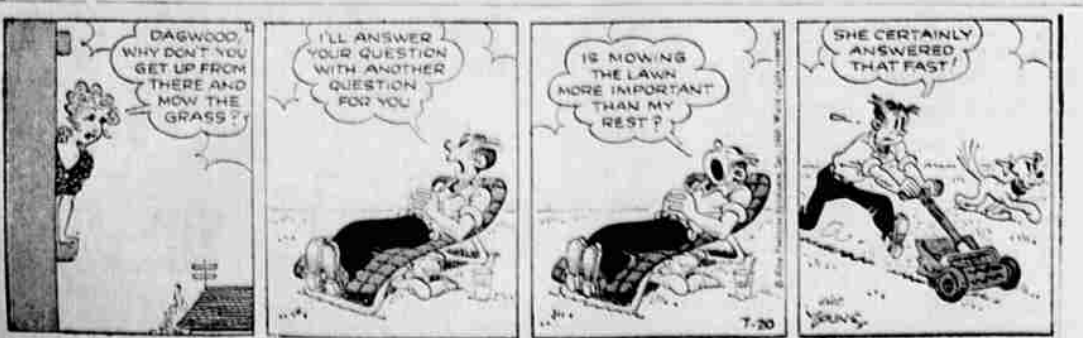
