Vic Damone's 'Lively Ones' Scheduled For Return On TV

HOLLYWOOD (UPI)—Television, dormant during the summer months, gets a shot in the arm this week with the return of "The Lively Ones," a musical melange hosted by Vic Damone.

The show made its debut last year as a summer replacement and quickly became a favorite of critics and viewers.

Encouraged by ratings and reviews, NBC-TV scheduled Damone and company again this year for eight weeks beginning July 25.

The singer and his producer, Barry Shear, resent the term "summer replacement." They argue that television occupies as many persons during the hot months as it does the rest of the year.

"There is no such thing as summer TV," said Shear. "No matter where people go this summer

they'll run into television sets—at the beach, on top of mountains, at the bottom of lakes—everywhere."

No Rock'n Roll

"Right," Damone said. "And we give 'em the kind of show that would cause just as much excitement during the regular season."

"The Lively Ones" projects jazz and popular standards in wildly improbable settings, informally without the hokey trappings of most musical shows. There are no formal introductions accompanied by fanfares and bleats of glee from captive studio audiences.

Neither do Damone and Shear swamp viewers with avant garde jazz, rock 'n roll nor teen-age idols screeching gibberish.

"We're not for the black-jacketed kids suffering from acne," said Shear. "All year long their kind
