

Legion Bees Down Albany Merchants In Doubleheader

Sunday was a banner day for the Roseburg Bees as they came home from Albany with their first twin sweep of the season. The Bees displayed a strong attack at the plate to dump the host Merchants by scores of 6-4 and 14-5 in a pair of seven inning games.

Sunday's double win gives coach Jerry Droscher's crew a 9-2 record for the season. Tuesday the second Roseburg Legion crew will invade Lowell for a twin-bill starting at 5:30 p.m. Lowell is a member of the Summer High School League in Lane County.

Albany scored first in the opening game when Gary Stark walked, Roger Holmes doubled and Tom Holbert singled. The Bees moved into the lead in the fourth with a two-run uprising. Chuck Person led off with a

double, and back-to-back walks to Ray Shepherd and Stan Young loaded the sacks. A pair of sacrifice flies by Chuck Dornisife and Gary Heeter drove the run across. In the sixth the winners exploded for four more counters. Shepherd singled and was sacrificed to second by Young. Dornisife collected a base rap. Heeter slapped a double and Mike Cashner and Butch Watson singled to give the Bees a 6-1 lead.

The Merchants bounced back with three runs in the bottom of the seventh on two walks, a throwing error, a fielder's choice and Holbert's double. However, the rally was two runs short as the Bees held on to post the win. Eusty Hubbard went the distance for the Bees to collect the victory, striking out five and walking four. Young and Heeter had perfect 2-2 records at the plate.

Liston Favored 5-1 To Keep Championship In Bout With Floyd Patterson Tonight

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (UPI)—Fast and fearless Floyd Patterson, admittedly in the best physical and mental condition of his career, will try tonight to stretch his record to three-time heavyweight king in a return title fight with champion Sonny Liston.

A victory by Patterson would knock Liston out of a "seven-million-dollar fight" with Cassius Clay at Philadelphia Sept. 30.

That the bout was not expected to last its scheduled 15 rounds was emphasized by the fact that all 51 votes for Sonny were on knockouts and nine of the 13 for Patterson called for kayoes.

Liston was a lopsided favorite because of his explosive left hook to body or head, and his ruggedness record of never having been knocked out or even floored in his 35 professional fights.

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Manolides Takes Lead In Tourney

ASTORIA (UPI)—Evan (Butch) Manolides of Seattle battled heavy rain and a driving wind to capture medalist honors in the qualifying round for the men's division of the Oregon Coast Golf Tournament Sunday.

He fired a one-over-par 35-38-73. Leighton Tuttle of Eugene finished second with 73. Tom Bearman of Willapa Harbor, Wash., and Rob Swingle of The Dalles tied for third with 76.

Match play in the championship flight began today, along with 18-hole qualifying rounds in the women's and Seniors' divisions.

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
