

Legion Bees Face Lowell 9 Tonight In Doubleheader

The Roseburg Bees will put their six-game winning streak on the line tonight in a doubleheader at Lowell against one of the powers of the Summer High School League in Lane County.

Game time tonight is set for 5:30 p.m.

Coach Jerry Droscher's Bees have emerged victorious in their last six outings to boast a 9-2 record for the season. The only losses have come at the hands of Cottage Grove and Lockwood Motors, the champs in Doug-Lane League play.

Tonight's doubleheader begins a busy final week of play for the second Roseburg American Legion team. Thursday the local crew will travel to Creswell for a single game with the Bulldogs at 6 p.m., then Friday an 8 p.m. outing is planned at Oakridge against the powerful Warriors who are setting the pace in the Summer High School League.

The Bees will finish the season Sunday at Cottage Grove with a 1:30 p.m. doubleheader against the Lions.

With 11 games under their belts, the top regular at the plate for the Bees is Chuck Person, a speedy outfielder from Douglas, has collected 16 hits in 42 at bats for a spectacular .381 average.

Stan Young, first baseman from Glendale, ranks second with 10 hits for 27 appearances and a .370 percentage.

The lone four-bagger for the Bees has been slapped by Charles Dornis.

Workhorse of the mound staff for the Bees is Rusty Hubbard. Hubbard has worked 32 2/3 innings to build up a 4-1 record. Pat Long has a 2-1 mark, while Ray Shepherd, Pete Woodworth and Doug Matson are all 1-0 for the season.

The probable starting infield for the Bees in tonight's game will find Young at first base, either Jim Kiser or Butch Watson at second, Mike Cashner at third and

Danny Withers at short. Dornis or Gary Heeter will work behind the plate.

The outfield starters include Person, Shepherd and either Jim Coon or Dornis. For reserve duty coach Droscher will have Bill King, Dave Fenner, Mike Doyle and Rian Brown.

There was action galore at Legion Field in Roseburg Monday night as the first round of the annual Kiwanis Pee Wee baseball jamboree took the limelight.

The second round will take place tonight, starting at 5:30, when the Minor League (10-11 year olds) will play. The Major League (12-13 year olds) will square off Thursday night.

Monday night's games featured the Midget League (8-9 year olds), and the younger set blasted their way through a total of 67 runs in the six games. And the action went all the way from the strong wins, 13-3, to a down-to-the-wire finish,

a 2-2 deadlock when the game was called because of the time limit.

In the opening game, the Green Rams defeated the Winchester Wolves by a slim 8-7 margin. Big hits of the game were a triple by Ron Koon of the Wolves and a double by B. Gregory of the Rams. The Rams pounded out eight hits and the Wolves collected seven hits. Cooper was the winning pitcher.

The Eastwood Bulldogs took advantage of six walks and a pair of errors to pick up nine runs in the first inning of their game with the Riverside Yankees and went on to win 13-3. John Decker and Kerry Swinford collected Eastwood's only two hits.

For Riverside, Terry Clark picked up the only hit, in the second inning when the Yankees scored three runs. Andy Fryer was the winning pitcher.

The Fullerton Cougars and the Winchester Wildcats battled to a 2-2 tie in the fifth game. In the final game of the evening, the All-Stars collected all eight of their runs in the first inning. The Braves scored two in the first and three in the second. Andy Fryer was the winning pitcher. Coach Bill Harper will be honored Wednesday night at Legion Field when the Lockwood Motors American Legion Juniors, Doug-Lane League champs, face Snellstrom Lumber (Sheldon) in the final circuit clashes of the year.

The twin-bill against the Sheldon crew has been officially designated as "Bill Harper Night" to give

Bill Harper top Legion record

fans a chance to show their appreciation for Harper's many years as head coach of the Roseburg Legion teams. Game time is set for 6:30 p.m.

Harper took over at the helm of the Legion program in 1953, and rapidly built Roseburg to one of, if not the, Legion power in the state. In 1956 Harper won his first state championship, after losing out to The Dalles and Denny Peterson in 1955. The 1956 team went on to win the Regional and Sectional crowns, then finished third in the World Series.

In 1959 Roseburg won its second state championship and captured the regional title before losing out in the Sectionals at Bend. State championships were gathered in by Harper coached teams again in 1961 and 1962, with this year's crew shooting for an unprecedented third straight crown.

To date, Harper has an overall record of 317 wins against just 72 losses since talking over in 1953. This includes a spectacular 38-7 record for the 1963 season. He will leave at the end of this season to join Oregon State's PE staff.

This year's team has already captured the Doug-Lane League championship for the third consecutive year, and is set to meet the winner of the Klamath Falls Falcons - Southern Curry series for the Area IV title.

The current conference champion Lockwood Motors team boasts a strong pitching staff headed by Drain southpaw Rian Cool. Cool has an 11-0 record on the hill, and figures to be a mainstay in the playoff battles.

Billed as the strikeout artist of the mound staff, Cool has whiffed 160 batters in 85 innings, has given up 16 runs, 36 hits and has walked 26.

Dick Williams ranks as the No. 2 star on the Roseburg mound staff with an 8-2 record, followed by Ron Westbrooks who sports a 7-2 mark. Rajello Gutierrez has shown strong since joining the team late. Gutierrez has a 5-0 mark.

Completing the pitching staff is Jerry Boucock with a 4-2 record and Jon Burnham with three wins and one loss.

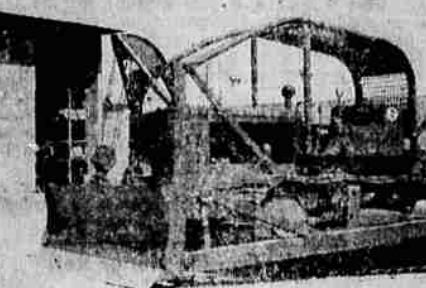
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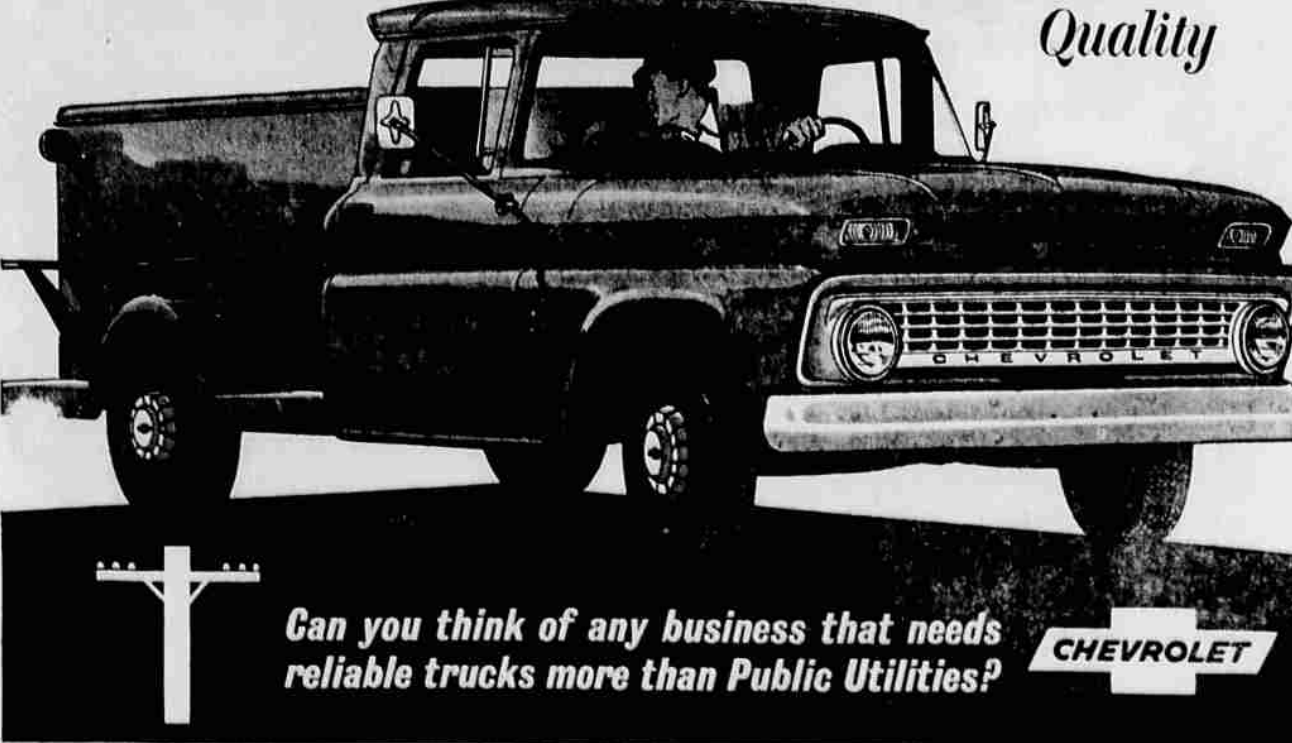
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
