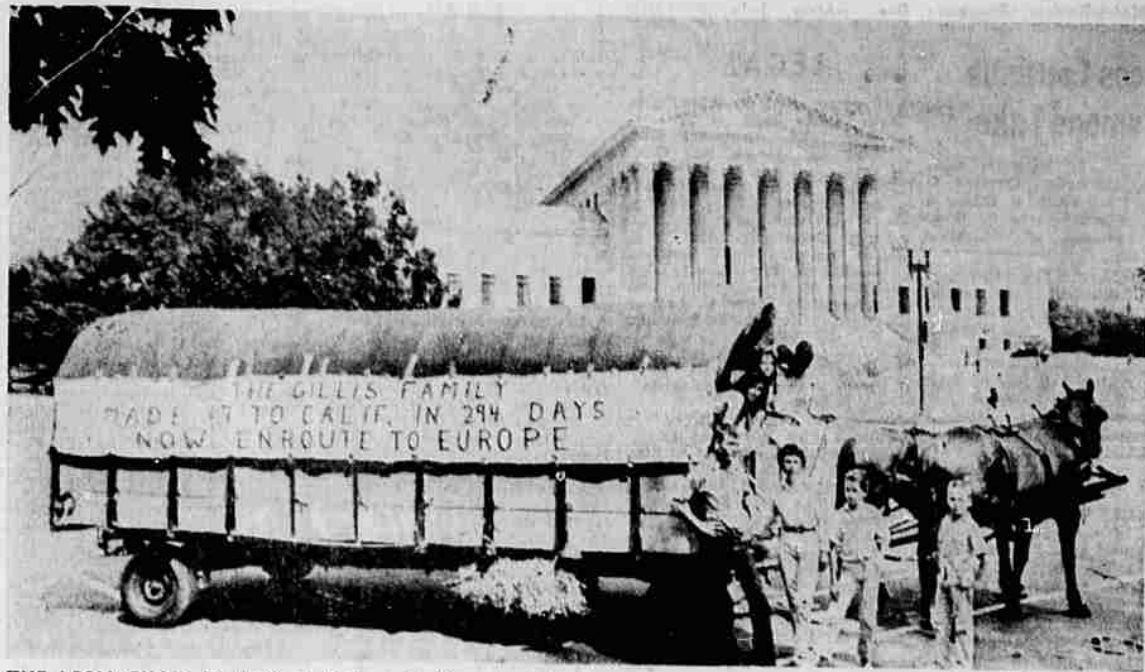

Astronaut 'Voice' To Be Reassigned

HOUSTON (UPI) — Dr. Robert Gilruth, director of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Manned Spacecraft Center, has confirmed that Col. John (Shorty) Powers, "voice of the Mercury astronauts," will be assigned to new duties.

Gilruth said Powers, public affairs officer for the spacecraft center, will be given new duties within the space program. The new assignment "will be announced as soon as we can determine in what way his talents and experience can best benefit NASA," Gilruth said.

There have been frequent rumors that Powers was to be fired from his job.

Powers "is on loan to NASA from the Air Force for assignment with Project Mercury," Gilruth said Friday night. "The project is completed and all its personnel are being reassigned."

There was no indication when an announcement on Powers' new duties might be made.

Tax Plan Title Arguments Set

SALEM (UPI)—Oral arguments on the ballot title for the proposed referendum on the tax plan passed by the recent legislature will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday before the Oregon Supreme Court.

A challenge to the title which had been prepared by Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton was filed by a Lane County group Thursday just 45 minutes before the deadline for such an appeal.

There was no indication by the court when it might hand down a decision.

Supreme Court approval of the ballot title is needed before petitions can be circulated to place the tax bill on a special election.

More than 23,000 signatures are needed by Sept. 1 if the special election is to be held.
