Pennsylvania Girl Killed As Lightning Bolt Strikes

Fair and dry weather prevailed over most of the nation today after scattered severe storms ruined crops in North Carolina, knocked out utility service in Pennsylvania and lashed Montgomery, Ala. The storm in Pennsylvania's Allegheny County Sunday knocked out electrical and telephone service in several Pittsburgh suburbs. The storm dropped the temperature 16 degrees in two hours. A lightning bolt struck and killed a 15-year-old girl in Shawnee State Park near Bedford, Pa., and another bolt struck a home in Brentwood, Pa.

Final Rites Slated For Crash Victim

Funeral services for Fred Lee Dickinson, 53, Elktion, are scheduled Tuesday at 2 p.m. in the First Christian Church in Elktion. Dickinson was killed in an automobile accident Friday at Odell Lake Junction in Lane County. He was reportedly on his way to Eastern Oregon to take a job on a ranch. He had been a log truck driver in the Elktion area for 14 years.

In the same accident, three Massachusetts residents were injured. State police said Dickinson's car failed to negotiate a curve on Highway 58 and collided with a car driven by H. Alden Bunker, 27, Lenox, Mass. Bunker's wife, Judith, 27, and Lucille Perry, 16, Hittam, Mass., were passengers in the Bunker vehicle.

Dickinson was born July 28, 1909, in Holdenville, Okla. He would have been 54 Sunday. He was married to his wife, Lizzie, Dec. 19, 1934. She survives him at Elktion. Also surviving are his father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. George Dickinson of Fresno, Calif.; four sons, Fred A. and Donald R., both of Roseburg, Ray H. with the U. S. Marine Corps in Honolulu, Hawaii, and James O. with the U. S. Air Force in England; and two daughters, LaWanda Solomon of Elktion and Margaret L. Maddox of Petaluma, Calif.

In charge of the service at Elktion will be the Rev. Ed West of the Elktion Christian Church. Interment will follow in the Elktion Cemetery. Oakridge Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

Three Youths Hurt In Auto Accident

Three teen-agers received minor injuries Saturday night when the car in which they were riding went off the road and rolled over twice near the junction of the Wilbur and Del Rio roads.

Injured were the driver of the vehicle, Myron Clell Gonn, 19, and two other youths, Jim Vernon Van Zandt, 14, and Walter Luther Nealey, 16, all of Sutherlin. A fourth boy, Raymond Wayne Fowler, 14, of Oakland, was reportedly not injured.

Roseburg state police said the boys were in a 1958 station wagon which was traveling south on Wilbur Road. At the junction of Del Rio Road, the police report stated, the vehicle skidded, flipped over the south bank of Del Rio Road, rolled over twice and came to rest on its wheels. The accident occurred about 7:45 p.m.

The injured boys were taken to the hospital by ambulance. All were treated and released Sunday morning. No injuries resulted when cars driven by William David Ledbetter, 18, of Winston, and Pamela Boatright, 17, of Roseburg, collided on Garden Valley Road near the W. Kline St. entrance at about 7:10 p.m. Sunday.

State police said the 1961 model car driven by Ledbetter was traveling east and the other car, a 1959 sedan, west, on Garden Valley Road. Officers said Ledbetter's car failed to negotiate a sharp turn crossed over the center line and smashed into the front end of the other car. Damage to both vehicles was reported minor.

Ledbetter was cited for failure to drive on the right side of the road.

There were four passengers in the car with Ledbetter. They were Steve Jimmy Melson, 18, Richard Lee Green, 18, and Laurence Sylvester Norton, 21, all of Winston, and Oscar Harry Simmons, 22, of Roseburg.

A passenger with Pamela Boatright in the other car was Frances Beth Simpson, 17, of Roseburg.

Park Improvements Slated For Review

The Roseburg Park and Playground Commission will meet Tuesday at 4 p.m. in the office of the city manager to review Stewart Park improvements and other activities in city parks.

At Stewart Park, the improvements to be discussed are road construction, softball field, golf course, Legion Field, the irrigation plan and master site development plan.
