Wilson of the Cow Creek District took Wilson, Blackwell and Miller and Clarence Rand, administrative officer in the Roseburg office, on a tour of his district over Callahan and Green Butte as far south as Goolaway Gap near the Josephine County line. Returning, they visited the newly developed Three Horn campground and the Divide Guard Station, both located southeast of Tiller on Highway 227.

### Basket Hung On Wall Novel Container Idea

A basket on the wall offers an interesting way to use flowers on hot summer days.

Using a shallow oval, fan-shaped or round basket, pre-saturate a foam flower holder with water, cover its bottom and sides with foil, and attach the holder to the basket with wire strung through the basket weave. Crush chick peas over the holder's exposed surface, and insert flower stems into the holder. Then hang the basket with picture wire and hooks just as with a painting.

Occasionally remove the basket from the wall in order to re-water the foam flower holder.
