Boaters Didn't Fare Well With Proposals On Gas Tax

Oregon boat owners didn't fare too well when they appeared before the recent session of the Oregon Legislature. The nation's boat owners now are carrying similar complaints to Congress and seemingly are doing a little better on the national scale than was the case in Oregon.

The amount involved is around \$15 million annually. However, there's some opposition to the transfer of money from the Highway Trust Fund "at least until the presently authorized highway improvement program is completed in 1972."

Countries have no restrictions covering the use of this money, Harder states. A few counties, he reports, use the money in methods approved by the Marine Board. Multnomah and Lane counties, particularly, are commended for using the license money to improve boating facilities.
