# Commie Guards Shoot Down Man, Woman As Hundreds Of West Berliners Look On

GOSLAR, Germany (UPI) — Shouts of "You are murderers" rang across the East-West border in Germany today near a spot where Communist guards shot down a man and a woman in plain sight of hundreds of witnesses.

Residents of Hohegeis, a vacation resort about 12 miles southeast of this city in lower Saxony, screamed their anger whenever a Communist uniform hove into view.

It was opposite Hohegeis that an East Germany army sergeant and a private opened fire Thursday on two persons who tried to escape the Soviet Zone. They shot from woods.

Both would-be refugees were dressed like farm workers. The man carried a scythe on his back.

**Shot In The Leg**

The woman fell with a bullet in her leg in the Communist "death zone," a plowed strip of land running east of doubled barbed wire fences, spectators on a nearby highway in West Germany said.

When the man was hit the first time, he threw away his scythe and managed to scramble over the first fence.

Georg Stein, 45, Goslar, one of hundreds of motorists who stopped to watch the drama that was unfolding before their eyes, told United Press International what happened next. He said:

"The man was hit again. He

dived into a bush between the two rows of barbed wire. Then he tried to get over the second fence.

"Suddenly I saw an East German army uniform come out of the bushes—a sergeant, I think. The uniform stood behind the first fence, took dead aim at the wounded man with his submachinegun and fired.

"The distance was no more than nine feet.

"The poor refugee crumpled. He was dead.

**Watched In Horror**

"Suddenly I realized I wasn't alone on the highway. Hundreds of tourists were watching in horror.

"There seemed to be a caravan of Danish cars on the road, all

stopped . . . all watching. And all the passengers in a Swedish tourist bus were there too, besides hundreds of West Germans.

"When the East German sergeant fired we yelled 'murderer.' We wouldn't stop shouting.

"Murderer," we yelled. 'You are murderers.'

Shortly afterwards, about 25 East German army reinforcements and a Communist armored car rolled up.

"They led away the limping woman. The blood-covered body of the slain man was taken away in an ambulance about two hours later.

"The East Germans ignored the shouts from the West.

"After the ambulance removed the body, the crowd began to break up.

# Brando To Get Court-Ordered Blood Test In Paternity Suit

SANTA MONICA, Calif. (UPI) — Marlon Brando and the infant daughter of a Filipino dancer will undergo court-ordered blood tests before an Aug. 15 hearing in connection with the mother's paternity suit against the actor.

A Superior Court judge set the hearing date Thursday when dancer Marie Cui testified that Brando acknowledged as recently as last Friday that the child is probably mine.

Miss Cui, 25, seeks \$775 monthly temporary support from the actor on her claim that he fathered her 5-month-old daughter. She said Brando, 37, had paid expenses incidental to the birth, but since has refused to pay the child's expenses.

Judge Edward R. Brand said he would appoint two doctors to make the tests. An attorney representing Brando, who did not appear in court, said tests already had been made. But Miss Cui's attorney, Bernard Cohen,

said he was not willing to accept the findings.

In an affidavit, Miss Cui said: "I unequivocally state that during the period of conception (summer of 1962), I did not have relations with anyone other than the said Marlon Brando."

"While I was pregnant the defendant (Brando) referred me to his doctor for prenatal care and he paid for said doctor."

"Moreover, there is a striking resemblance between the defendant and said child. In fact, last Friday, July 26, defendant came to my home to see the child and while there he said in my presence and in the presence of others: 'The child is probably mine.'

# State Reveals Move To Trim Welfare Rolls

SALEM (UPI)—New efforts to eliminate ineligible persons from Oregon's welfare rolls were announced Thursday by State Welfare Administrator Andrew F. Juras.

Earlier it was announced in Washington, D.C., that 5.4 percent of the persons on Oregon Aid to Dependent Children rolls had been found to be ineligible.

The Oregon figure was identical to that of the national average found in a survey made last winter by federal officials. The survey was made public Thursday.

Juras declared the Oregon Welfare Department would go beyond minimum federal requirements, in his efforts to cut ineligible recipients from the rolls.

Federal requirements now specify a continuous review of eligibility; re-determination of eligibility for all ADC families every six months and state-by-state reviews of program administration.

Investigators hired are being hired to probe suspected frauds and complicated property cases where eligibility is questioned by either the regular caseworker or the special reviewers.

Welfare workers will check industrial accident and unemployment compensation lists to be sure welfare recipients aren't getting money from those sources.

New efforts are being made in the state to simplify welfare standards and policies in order to cut the chance of error, Juras said.

The federal survey found that some families, even though eligible, received incorrect amounts of ADC assistance. It indicated that 61 persons received overpayments while 38 families were entitled to more money.

Deliberate fraud was indicated in less than half of the Oregon families where ineligibility was found.

# Bodies Removed At Blast Ruins

SUDBURY, Ont. (UPI) — The bodies of six persons have been recovered from the ruins of a service station - restaurant near here that was demolished by an explosion of unknown origin late Thursday.

Another person was critically injured and five others were in fair condition in hospitals following the explosion at Hammer, 17 miles north of here.

Two others suffered minor injuries but were treated and later released from a hospital.

The names of the six dead were not released. Ontario provincial police still were searching the smoldering ruins for the body of a seventh person who was believed to have been in the building.

In critical condition at St. Joseph's Hospital here was Giselle Lebel, 15, Field, Ont.

Hospital officials said five others, Linda Duguay, 14, Rene Menard, 14, John Ross, 17, all of Hammer, and Edward Thorpe, 27, Sudbury, were in fair condition.
