Winchester's Red Sox bowed to defeat for the first time in Major League (boys 12-13) Pee Wee action Tuesday when the High School Giants rolled to a 10-7 victory.

Craig Munion led the Giants with a triple and a single for four RBIs, while Chris Cave was credited with the win on the mound.

In other Major League action the Eastwood Orioles dumped the Green Huskies, 10-2. Dean Bogner and Jack Smith led the Orioles attack with three hits each as Barry Baker tossed a neat two-hitter.

The Fullerton Cubs remained undefeated in Minor League (boys 10-11) play by stomping the Riverside Indians, 11-1. Duke DeBernardi was in complete control of the opposing hitters from start to finish. Winchester's Senators remained one game behind the league leaders by downing the High School Pirates, 7-1.

The Cubs and the Senators have a crucial contest set for Thursday at the Joseph Lane diamond.

In other Minor League games the Fullerton Mets topped the Riverside Angels, 8-5, the High School Dodgers downed the Winchester White Sox, 5-2, and the Eastwood Athletics stopped the Eastwood Vikings, 5-1.

The Winchester Wildcats handed the High School Braves their first Midget League (boys 8-9) loss by a score of 5-4. Taking advantage of the Braves' loss, the Fullerton Cougars moved into a first place tie as Tom Hennebeck pitched an 11-8 win over the Riv-

erside Tigers. The Riverside Yankees whitewashed the High School Cardinals, 8-0, and the Eastwood Twins downed the Green Rams, 10-4, in other Midget League games.

Homers Spark 13-8 Roseburg Triumph

Manning, Markham Provide Power To Pace Deadly 7-Run Explosion

Powerful blasts off the bats of Bob Manning and Mike Markham accounted for a seven-run uprising for Lockwood Motors in the sixth frame and paved the way for a Roseburg victory in the third game of the best-of-five series for the Oregon American Legion baseball crown.

Using the spectacular uprising as a spring board, the local powerhouse toppled Sargent Construction (Madison) by a 13-8 count to take a 2-1 lead in the series.

The fourth game of the championship series will be staged tonight at Legion Field, and if Lockwood's bests Madison it will be over. If Madison wins tonight the fifth and deciding game will be played Friday at Legion Field.

Coach Bill Harper has named Rojelio Gutierrez (5-0) as the starter tonight, with either Keith Lampard (10-0), or Steve Chamberlain as the probable starter for the Portland crew.

Come From Behind

Trailing 3-2 going into the bottom of the sixth inning the Lock-

wood Motors squad came to life when Ron Westbrook slapped a two-out single. Mike Blomberg followed with a free pass and Artie McDonald was hit by a pitch on a one and two count to load the sacks.

Manning stepped to the plate and worked his way to a two and two count, then sent a high pop foul behind the plate which the catcher misjudged. On the next pitch Manning became a hero as he broke the game open by drilling a high fly over the left field wall some 360 feet from home plate for a grand-slam.

However, Manning's poke was not the last of the excitement for the inning. Jim Beamer followed with a walk and Tom Morrison singled. Both runners moved up 90 feet on a wild pitch to set the scene for Markham's circuit clout. Markham picked on a 3-1 pitch and belted the ball into orbit at the 330 foot mark.

After Roseburg's seven-run output in the sixth it was an uphill climb for Sargent's rest of the night. Two runs scored in the top of the seventh and three more came across in the ninth when Keith Lampard drilled the ball over the fence in right field.

In the seventh Dave Schacher singled and was forced at second by Phil Bushman. Lampard followed with a base rap and both runners advanced on a passed ball. Ron Lucas singled to drive in the two runs.

Another Rally

Roseburg got the runs back in the bottom of the inning, along with two extras. Westbrook singled to start the rally. Blomberg drew a walk and McDonald beat out an infield hit to load the bases. Manning singled to left scoring two and Beamer was intentionally passed to load the bases again. Tom Morrison came through with a line shot to left to add two more runs to the ever growing total for Roseburg.

Madison's three runs in the ninth came as Schacher tripled, Wally Linder drew a walk and Lampard blasted a four-bagger.

Early in the game Madison had taken the lead as Roseburg had trouble holding onto the ball in the outfield. The Portland team scored single counters in each of the first, second and third frames, while Lockwood's picked up runs in the second and third.

The visitors scored first in the initial frame Bushman singled and took second when the ball got away from the outfield, then raced home when Lampard drilled a shot through the box. In the second a single by Hal Smith and a pair of Roseburg errors accounted for the second run, while Schacher singled and moved to second on an error and scored on Lampard's base rap in the third.

Roseburg's first score came in the second on walks to Morrison and Sevall, an interference call on the catcher and Westbrook's sacrifice fly. In the third singles by Beamer, Morrison and Sevall accounted for the second run.

Westbrook went the distance to pick up the win for Roseburg, but found the going rough at times.

The Myrtle Creek southpaw was bombed for 11 hits, issued three walks and struck out six. Madison started Hugh O'Donnell, then called shortstop Smith to come in for relief work in the sixth.

Big Bats Boom

The big bats for both teams came to life in the third game of the playoffs, with a total of 25 hits being pounded off the three pitchers.

Heading Roseburg's attack was Manning with three hits in six trips to the plate, including his grand-slam homer, and six RBIs. Beamer had a perfect 2-2 record. Morrison was 3-3 and Westbrook helped his own cause with three hits in four at bats.

Lampard, packing a healthy .473 batting average at the start of the series, came to life to collect four hits in five trips to the plate, including a round-tripper. Schacher also carried a big bat for Sargent's with a 3-5 record and one extra base blow—a triple.

Johnson Eyes Homer Mark; Padres Edge Beavers, 3-0

There isn't much danger of Deron Johnson breaking the Pacific Coast League home run record but he's having a go at it after returning to the San Diego lineup in June.

Johnson, a native son of San Diego, has a total of 30 four-ply swats to his credit this year. He has played in 105 games and would have to hit almost a homer a game to shatter the mark of 60 set by Tony Lazzeri with Salt Lake City in 1925. Johnson has 34 games left to play.

The Padre outfielder was out of action for about two and one-half weeks due to injury, otherwise his output undoubtedly would have been greater. Since Aug. 1

he has whacked five round trippers.

The 25-year old right handed slugger led the Nebraska League in home runs in 1956 and the Eastern loop in 1957. Most of last campaign was spent in the U. S. Army by Johnson.

Although Johnson's blunderbuss did not blast Wednesday night, the Padres managed to down Portland 3-0 on the fine hurling of Jim Owens, who made his debut in the PCL a winning one. He tired in the 9th and Dick Laebke finished the game for him.

The Padres swept the three game series. Chico Ruiz stole his 39th and 40th bases and scored twice. His base swiping total equaled his 1962 total.
