CAR, BUFFALO COLLIDE

KANKAKEE, ILL. (UPI) — Lawrence Hitz reported that his new \$3,600 convertible automobile was demolished recently in a collision with a buffalo. The animal, a refugee from a wild game farm, had to be destroyed.
