Subdividers Face Mail Fraud Trial

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Tax collections during fiscal 1963 reached an estimated record high of \$105.9 billion, the Internal Revenue Service said recently.

The IRS report said individual income and employment taxes rose to \$67.9 billion while corporate tax collections hit the \$22.3 billion mark.

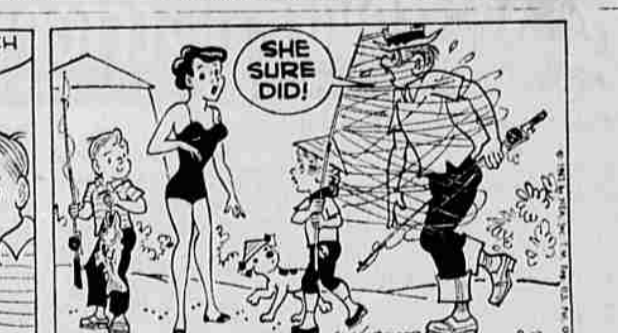
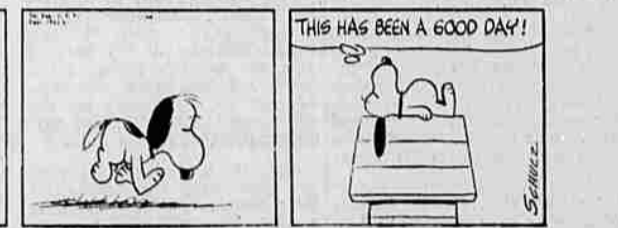
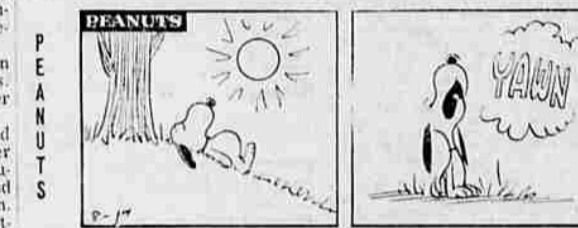
