Moon Survival Tests Staged In Bend Area

BEND (UPI)—Preliminary tests will be the key to survival for the first American landing on the moon were performed Wednesday in Derrick Cave, a long lava cavern in the rugged Devils Garden country northeast of Fort Rock.

Witnessing the tests were North American Aviation, Inc. personnel, a representative of the Oregon Department of Planning and Development, lunar geologist Dr. Jack Green, and a representative of Pacific Northwest Bell, the firm which provided planes for the test.

Several tons of railroad steel were taken into the cave for the density test, and attempts were made to locate the banded steel through use of gravity instruments. A plane will be used later in a test of airborne instruments.

Dr. Green said various types of rock will be collected in Central Oregon to determine water content that will serve as a standard for pre-lunar landing studies.
