

Yoncalla Schools To Open Sept. 9

The opening of school in Yoncalla School District No. 32 will be delayed one week due to the late harvest of crops and school will begin Sept. 9. A full day of school will be held at that time with the cafeteria at Scotts Valley and Yoncalla Elementary operating.

Bus routes will be the same as last year with one additional run leaving Yoncalla Elementary School at 8:30 a.m. to transport all first and second graders to Scotts

Valley and return by 3:30 each afternoon. The bus routes are: Elkhead route, driver Mildred Thiel; Shoestring route, driver Charles Clark.

Red Hill - Pleasant Valley route, driver Charles Vian, also additional run to and from Scotts Valley with 1st and 2nd grades; Rice Valley, Boswell Springs, driver Arnie Bjork; Hayhurst, Ialo Trail, driver Otto Sanders; and Anlauf, Cox Creek, driver Rita Turner. Bus four and six will transport

all students grades 3-12 who live in Scotts Valley area to town.

Principal of both grade schools this year will be Eugene Gustafson. The high school principal and superintendent will be Donald E. Dick.

Non-certified personnel will be: secretaries, Ann Mathis and Lois Sutton; custodians, Bill Boan, Tommy Palmer, Mike McKern and Esther Dodd; cooks, Jean Carney, Dorothy Loyd and Jane Applegate; bus drivers, Arnie Bjork, Charles Clark, Rita Turner, Mildred Thiel, Charles Vian and Otto Sanders.

During the summer the maintenance crew has been busy painting the interior of several classrooms, grade and high school gym, exterior of Scotts Valley school and the Yoncalla Elementary school. In addition, roof repair, remodeling of office at high school, cleaning and waxing of all floors and the many other jobs needed to put the build-

ing in good repair for the opening of school have been performed.

Registration will be held in Room 6 of the high school. Registration for 9th and 10th grade students will be held on Sept. 3, at which time physical examinations will be given all 9th graders and fees will be paid. Sept. 4 will be registration for grades 11 and 12. Hours for registration will be 9 - 12 a.m. and 1 - 4 p.m. Students working and unable to register during the day may register on Sept. 3 from 7-9 p.m.

Students who will be attending Yoncalla Elementary School are requested to register on Sept. 3 and 4 at the Yoncalla Grade school office from 9 to 12 a.m. and 1 to 4 p.m. This will assist in room assignment prior to classes beginning Sept. 8. All students entering the first grade for the first time are required to have a physical examination and a birth certificate or other evidence of their age.

Teacher In-Service will be held on Sept. 5 and 6 prior to the opening of school.

Douglas High Addition Due For Occupancy On Sept. 3

All major improvements being made or completed in School District 116, Winston, have been centered at Douglas High School during the summer months.

The construction of four additional rooms is nearing completion and expected to be ready on Sept. 3, when the bell rings for the opening of the fall term at Douglas High.

Another costly improvement at the high school is a separate sewage disposal plant to serve the expected enrollment of 487 students at the beginning of the term.

At a special election voters from Winston, Tennile, Lookingglass and Dillard approved plans for this plant in lieu of a previously planned hookup from the school to the Winston sewage disposal system.

Actual construction is pending final approval from the Health Department, which is expected this week.

Plans are to move the sixth grade from Lookingglass school to the Winston Junior High School in order to relieve an overload at Lookingglass.

Anticipated total increase in enrollment in the district has been approximated at 64 above that of the fall of 1962, or 1,128 in the elementary schools with a predicted 487 at the high school.

No major changes or remodeling other than normal repairs have been made in the district other than the remodeling and enlargement of the high school science laboratory, which was completed last week.

Mrs. Margaret Boyd, who taught the fourth grade at Tennile, has resigned. This vacancy was very recently filled by the hiring of Mrs. Joan Aspen, formerly of Springfield.

Registration Dates Set For Myrtle Creek School

Registration for Myrtle Creek high school students will take place Aug. 30 through Sept. 4.

Freshmen will register Aug. 30; sophomores, Sept. 3; and juniors and seniors Sept. 4. Each day, registration for classes will take place from 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 3 p.m. at the school.



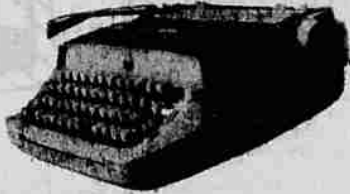

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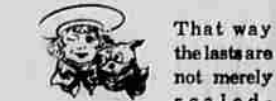
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
