

Attendance Areas Listed For Roseburg Students

Roseburg school officials have announced the boundary lines to be used for attendance areas for the junior high schools and elementary schools in Roseburg this year.

School attendance areas are:

BENSON — The south boundary of the Benson attendance area is the center of Douglas and East Douglas Avenue as far east as Claire Street where the boundary turns north to Deer Creek, then follows Deer Creek to the Deer Creek Bridge. The eastern boundary of the Benson attendance area is an imaginary line drawn from Deer Creek Bridge straight north between Gardner Street and Rifle Range Road. On the west side of the Benson area, the boundary line is an imaginary line west of Stephens Street to Imbler Avenue. This area includes all children living on Prospect and Bellview. The north boundary line goes down the center of Imbler Street thence eastward to a point above the end of Lincoln Street, Kinney Drive and Arrowhead Avenue.

EASTWOOD — The western boundary of the Eastwood attendance area lies from Deer Creek south on the east of Claire Street to Douglas Avenue, thence eastward to the Catholic Cemetery, thence southward. The southern boundary encompasses Rust and Leland Streets, Colorado Drive, Eastwood Street, Ramp Street and follows an imaginary line from Ramp Street eastward to the east boundary of the school district. The north boundary line of Eastwood is an imaginary point on Deer Creek eastward to the Deer Creek Bridge on Douglas Avenue. The boundary line turns north and parallels Rifle Range Road on the west.

It may be necessary to shift other pupils from one school to another depending upon the number of pupils enrolling at certain grade levels. This will be accomplished through individual conferences with parents and principal.

FIR GROVE — All students south and west of the River, which will include Umpqua Park west to West Stanton Street, not including students living on that street. Also students living between the Southern Pacific Railway tracks and the Umpqua River shall attend Fir Grove.

FULLERTON IV — All students from West Stanton Street (and including those who live on that street) west to Rocky Point and all locations south of the River.

GREEN — All pupils living

south of the city limits to the Winston Bridge will attend the Green School. This area includes Glenary and Roberts Creek Community.

HUCREST — All children, grades 1 through 6, living in the area north of the South Umpqua River and west of U. S. Highway 99, will attend the Hucrest Elementary School. One exception is that portion of the Sweetbrier area west of Interstate Highway 5 which is served by the underpass road.

MELROSE — All pupils living west of Rocky Point on Melrose Road will attend the Melrose School.

RIVERSIDE — The Riverside Elementary School attendance area is bounded on the west by U. S. Highway 99 or Interstate Highway 5. Pupils who live in the Sweetbrier area west of the highway, e.g., on Broad Avenue and that general area, will also attend Riverside. The northern boundary is an imaginary line drawn between Hewitt and Clover Lanes. All children living east of the Airport Road, including Cloverdale area and as far south as Imbler Avenue, and all pupils living in the area south of the Riverside School to the Umpqua River.

ROSE — The north boundary of the Rose attendance area is the center of Douglas Avenue and East Douglas Avenue to a point eastward to the Catholic Cemetery. The west boundary of the Rose attendance area is the Southern Pacific railroad tracks and the Umpqua River south to the city limits near Mark's No. 2 Market. The eastern boundary is the city limits on the east and it includes extensions of Summit Street and Illinois Avenue. The southern boundary of the Rose attendance area is the city limits on the south including pupils living on Strong Avenue and Ichabod Street.

WILBUR - WINCHESTER — The southern boundary of the Wilbur-Winchester attendance area is an imaginary line running east and west between Hewitt and Clover Lanes on the east side of the railroad. The 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th graders will attend Winchester; the 5th and 6th graders will attend Wilbur.

Until the new Winchester addition is completed sometime in December, it will be necessary to transport the 3rd and 4th grades to temporary quarters in other buildings. The three third grade rooms will be housed at Riverside. One class of the fourth grade will

be held at Hucrest and the other two classes will use the Riverside building. All six of these "away from home" classes and their teachers will be under the supervision of the Winchester principal, Mr. Kenneth Speedie, and will move to the new building upon its completion.

JOHN C. FREMONT JUNIOR HIGH — All students of the Fir Grove, Fullerton IV, Rose, Melrose and Green except (from Kelly's Corner south on U. S. 99, Dee-Lite Trailer Court, Landers Lane, Harmony Lane and Green Meadows Trailer Court) attendance areas will attend John C. Fremont Junior High.

JOSEPH LANE JUNIOR HIGH — All students from the Hucrest, Riverside, Wilbur - Winchester and Benson - Eastwood attendance areas will attend Joseph Lane Junior High. Also students living in the portion of the Green area which includes the area from Kelly's Corner south on U. S. 99, Dee-Lite Trailer Court, Landers Lane, Harmony Lane and Green Meadows Trailer Court.

Stuart Is Selected For Swedish Trip

Kenneth A. Stuart, superintendent of the Riddle School District, is going to Sweden this fall.

He was one of a group of 79 school administrators from nearly every state of the union selected under the sponsorship of the American Association of School Administrators, the "Meet Modern Sweden" Committee of Stockholm and the Experiment in International Living group.

The "Meet Modern Sweden" Committee is a group of Swedish industrialists, who have arranged transportation and accommodations, as well as a program of activities for the visitors.

The group will leave New York Sept. 18. It will spend five weeks in Sweden touring the countryside and observing the Swedish educational system. For three weeks of their stay, the Americans will be guests in the homes of Swedish families.

School Consolidation Is Considered By Myrtle Creek, Canyonville Boards

Douglas County's efforts to consolidate more of its districts for more efficient operation of schools made little headway this year.

Two projects were undertaken by the Rural School Board, which took over the task from the county Reorganization Committee. Neither panned out. However, a consolidation project is in the offing between Myrtle Creek and Canyonville.

The biggest project was the plan for reorganization of three southern Douglas County districts into one administrative district. They were Days Creek-Tiller, Myrtle Creek and Canyonville. It was the Days Creek-Tiller district which would have no part of it. It snubbed the reorganization, 156-96, thus killing the plan. Unanimous approval from all three districts is necessary.

Both Myrtle Creek and Canyonville gave their approval. The plan was to consolidate the districts into a single district to be served by a new high school at Tri-City.

With Days Creek-Tiller out, recent efforts have been made to consolidate Myrtle Creek and Canyonville. Both school boards have indicated they favor the project, but Myrtle Creek isn't willing to accept Canyonville's indebtedness.

Meanwhile, on the coast, another consolidation effort to form a unified district with grades 1-12, also went down to defeat. The proposal was to establish a district to include Reedsport Union High and Gardner districts. Gardner rejected this plan.

Thus, the latest count of districts still stands at 19 for the county.
